## REDSKINS FACE JAGUARS ON THE ROAD IN WEEK 15

The Washington Redskins will travel to face the Jacksonville Jaguars. Kickoff is scheduled for 1 p.m. ET.

Last week in the loss to NY Giants, quarterback Josh Johnson entered the game in the second half and completed 11-of-16 pass attempts for 195 yards and one touchdown. Johnson threw a 79-yard touchdown pass in the fourth quarter. The score was a career long touchdown pass for Johnson and his first touchdown pass since 2011 as a member of the Tampa Bay Buccaneers. He also rushed for 45 yards on seven attempts and scored his first career touchdown run.

The game was his first since Dec 22, 2013 when he was a member of the Cincinnati Bengals. Following the game, Redskins Head Coach Jay Gruden named Johnson the starter for Week 15.

"I think the element he brings, a little bit, knowing the system," said Gruden. "He came in here and he was playing a pickup basketball game and came in here and is playing in the National Football League on a Sunday. My hat's off to him for picking it up. Fortunately, he's been around me for a while and can handle the terminology and did a pretty good job moving around."

## CLASS OF 2018: BOBBY BEATHARD ENSHRINED IN THE PRO FOOTBALL FAME

**RICHMOND, Va. [Aug. 4, 2018]** — Former Washington Redskins General Manager Bobby Beathard was enshrined in Canton, Ohio at the Pro Football Hall of Fame as a member of the Class of 2018. Beathard, the architect behind some of the most legendary teams in Redskins lore, was presented by former Washington Redskins head coach and Pro Football Hall of Famer Joe Gibbs.

Beathard's illustrious career as an NFL executive included 11 seasons as General Manager of the Redskins from 1978-88. After taking the job on Feb. 24, 1978, Beathard guided the organization to three Super Bowl appearances, including victories in Super Bowls XVII and XXII. Many of the players he acquired remained on the roster for the team's Super Bowl XXVI victory as well.

In Beathard's 11 seasons as General Manager, the Redskins averaged 9.5 wins a year. The team posted a regular season winning percentage of .625 (105-63) in that time frame, best in the NFC and second-best in the NFL. No team in that time frame posted a better postseason winning percentage than the Redskins, who went 11-3 in postseason play in his tenure for a winning percentage of .786.

Draft classes during Beathard's tenure featured three members of the Pro Football Hall of Fame, including wide receiver Art Monk (1980, No. 18 overall), guard Russ Grimm (1981, No. 69) and cornerback Darrell Green (1983, No. 28).

The classes also featured four additional members of the Redskins Ring of Fame, including linebacker Monte Coleman (1979, No. 289), defensive end Dexter Manley (1981, No. 119), defensive end Charles Mann (1983, No. 84) and quarterback Mark Rypien (1986, No. 146).

Additionally, Beathard oversaw the college free agent additions of Redskins Ring of Famers Jeff Bostic and Joe Jacoby and supplemented the team with a number of former USFL stars, including quarterback Doug Williams and wide receivers Gary Clark and Ricky Sanders. All of the players listed were led on the field by Coach Gibbs, the former San Diego Chargers offensive coordinator whom Beathard hired prior to the 1981 season.

Beathard began his career as a part-time scout for the American Football League's Kansas City Chiefs in 1963. He earned an AFL championship ring with the organization in 1966 en route to the team's berth in Super Bowl I. He would later serve as a scout for the Atlanta Falcons from 1968-71 and as Director of Player Personnel for the Miami Dolphins from 1972-77 prior to joining the Redskins. He finished his career as General Manager of the San Diego Chargers, serving in that capacity from 1990-2000. In all, Beathard's teams made seven Super Bowl appearances, including one by Kansas City (1966), two by Miami (1972-73), three by Washington (1982-83 and 1987) and one by San Diego (1994).

Beathard was born in Zanesville, Ohio, on Jan. 24, 1937. He grew up in the Los Angeles area and attended El Segundo H.S. before playing quarterback at Cal Poly-San Luis Obispo, where he helped lead the 1957 and 1958 teams to consecutive 9-1 records.

Larry Brown rushed for 105 yards and Charlie Harraway notched two rushing touchdowns, as the Redskins edged the Giants 20-14. Sonny Jurgensen connected 11-of-22 pass attempts for 111 yards to complement a rushing attack that recorded 172 combined yards. The Redskins scored 20 unanswered points and Rickie Harris sealed the comeback with an 86-yard punt return for a touchdown late in the fourth quarter.

**WIN '400'**


After trailing 9-0 at halftime, the Washington Redskins were able to shut down the Bears offense in the second half and win 10-9. Despite five interceptions, Redskins quarterback Mark Rypien threw a critical touchdown pass to Gary Clark. Clark finished with six receptions for 85 yards in the victory. Kicker Chip Lohmiller sealed the win with 2:14 left in the game on a 35-yard field goal.

**WIN '100'**

Sammy Baugh completed 25-of-41 pass attempts for 343 yards and three touchdowns as the Redskins cruised to a 40-13 victory over the Boston Yanks. Dick Poillon recorded one receiving touchdown, one rushing touchdown and kicked four extra points in the victory. Both teams combined to turn the ball over eight times, but the Redskins capitalized on the mistakes gaining 574 total yards from scrimmage and 28 first downs.

The Redskins rallied from a 10-0 first half deficit to secure a 16-13 win over the New York Giants. Mark Murphy and Rich Milot led the defense with one interception each and kicker Mark Mosely tied the game in the fourth quarter en route to the win.

**WIN '500'**

Clinton Portis rushed for 148 yards and a touchdown on 29 carries and kicker John Hall notched three field goals in a 16-10 win over the Tampa Bay Buccaneers. Portis scored the only offensive touchdown of the game in the first quarter on a 64-yard rushing touchdown. Antonio Pierce tallied an interception and the defense recorded four sacks, five passes defended and two forced fumbles to limit Tampa Bay's offense.



## WHAT TO WATCH FOR THIS WEEK

- » Safety **DJ Swearinger Sr.** tallying multiple interceptions in a single game for the fourth time in his career as a Redskin and becoming only the fourth player in franchise history to accomplish the feat.

- » Cornerback **Fabian Moreau** recording his fourth forced fumble of the season and setting a franchise record for most forced fumbles by a defensive back in a single season.

## A WIN OVER THE JAGUARS WOULD

- ... mark the 600th regular season victory in franchise history and would make Washington the fifth franchise in NFL history to accomplish the feat, joining the Chicago Bears [757], Green Bay Packers [741], New York Giants [691] and Pittsburgh Steelers [626].

## HEAD COACH JAY GRUDEN

Jay Gruden enters his fifth season with the Washington Redskins in 2018 after being named the 29th head coach in franchise history on January 9, 2014.

Previously a decorated quarterback in the college and Arena Football League ranks and a successful NFL assistant, Gruden has showcased his offensive acumen honed from his diverse football background throughout his tenure with the Redskins.

In 2017, the Redskins won at least seven games for their third straight season for the first time since a four-year streak from 1999-2002, marking the fourth-longest streak of seven-win seasons in team history. Gruden's team reached seven wins despite dealing with substantial injury issues throughout the season, as 72 different players appeared in game action for the squad, the second-most used by the team in a single season since the 1970 AFL-NFL merger, trailing only the 108 used to complete the 1987 strike season.

Among the team's highlights in the 2017 season was the team's 4-0 record against NFC West opponents, the franchise's second full-division sweep since NFL realignment in 2002 and the team's first since 2005. The season also produced three Pro Bowlers, with linebacker Ryan Kerrigan, guard Brandon Scherff and tackle Trent Williams all earning return selections among the league's best.

A year earlier, Gruden guided the Redskins to an 8-7-1 record in 2016, giving the franchise back-to-back winning seasons for the first time since 1996-97. The team was led by Gruden's record-shattering offense, which posted team records in total net yards (6,545), net passing yards (4,758) and yards per play (6.40), ranking in the Top 3 in the NFL in all three categories.

Gruden's offense — once called "easily one of the three or four best designed offenses in the NFL" by Andy Benoit of The MMQB — was more than just historically efficient and explosive that season. The distribution of the offensive contributions allowed eight Redskins players (DeSean Jackson, Pierre Garçon, Jamison Crowder, Rob Kelley, Chris Thompson, Jordan Reed, Vernon Davis and Matt Jones) to finish the season with at least 500 yards from scrimmage, tying the 2011 New Orleans Saints for the most in a single season in NFL history.

In 2015, Gruden led the Redskins to an NFC East Championship, posting a 9-7 record to complete the second "worst-to-first" turnaround in team history. Gruden became the sixth coach in team history to lead the Redskins to a playoff berth within the first two years at the helm, joining Ray Flaherty, Dutch Bergman, Dudley DeGroot, George Allen and Joe Gibbs.

Under Gruden's guidance, the 2015 Redskins featured what was at the time the most prolific passing attack in franchise history. Quarterback Kirk Cousins, named the starter in the middle of the preseason, set then-single-season team records for attempts (543), completions (379), passing yards (4,166) and 300-yard passing games (seven) while throwing 29 touchdown passes, including at least one in all 16 games. Cousins' success coincided with the emergence of tight end Jordan Reed, who finished the season with 87 receptions for 952 yards (both team records for a tight end) with 11 receiving touchdowns.

Gruden assumed control of the Redskins in 2014 and guided the team through a campaign in which three different quarterbacks (Robert Griffin III, Kirk Cousins and Colt McCoy) recorded victories as starters. He installed an offensive system that produced two Pro Bowlers in his first season (tackle Trent Williams and running back Alfred Morris).

Excluding interim coaches, Gruden, 46 at the time of his hiring, became the team's youngest head coaching hire since hiring eventual Pro Football Hall of Famer Joe Gibbs at 40 years of age in 1981. He became the first Redskins head coach hired directly from an offensive coordinator role on another team since Norv Turner in 1994.

Before joining the Redskins, Gruden spent his previous three seasons as offensive coordinator for the Cincinnati Bengals. In his tenure in Cincinnati, the Bengals averaged 10 wins a season, making three consecutive playoff appearances and earning an AFC North championship in 2013. Members of the Bengals' offense accounted for seven Pro Bowl selections in his three seasons in Cincinnati.

Gruden was tasked with the development of quarterback Andy Dalton, a 2011 second-round pick. In three seasons together, Gruden helped Dalton to a 30-18 regular season record as a starter (.625), as Dalton's 30 wins in that time frame ranked tied for fifth-most among NFL quarterbacks. Dalton's 80 passing touchdowns ranked third-most in NFL history for a quarterback in his first three seasons, trailing only Dan Marino (98) and Peyton Manning (85).

Prior to joining the Bengals, Gruden served two years with the Florida Tuskers of the United Football League from 2009-10. In 2009, Gruden served as offensive coordinator as the Tuskers compiled a 6-0 regular season record and earned a UFL championship game berth. In 2010, he assumed the roles of head coach and general manager and led the Tuskers to their second consecutive championship game appearance.

Gruden coached for seven seasons (2002-08) with the Tampa Bay Buccaneers, earning a Super Bowl championship ring as an offensive assistant in 2002. There he worked under his brother, Jon (then the Bucs' head coach), and current Redskins President Bruce Allen (the Bucs' general manager from 2004-08). Gruden helped guide the Buccaneers to the team's first championship, a 48-21 victory in Super Bowl XXXVII.

Gruden also ranks among the most outstanding players and coaches in the history of the Arena Football League, having won six combined league championships — four as a quarterback and two as a head coach. Gruden played quarterback (2002-03) and served as head coach (2004-08) of the AFL's Orlando Predators while simultaneously working as an offensive assistant with the Buccaneers. In all, Gruden served as head coach of the Predators for nine seasons (1998-2001 and 2004-08), leading the Predators to four championship game appearances and two league titles as a coach. During a two-year hiatus from coaching the Predators in 2002-03, he returned to the playing field as Orlando's quarterback, leading the Predators to playoff appearances in both seasons.

In his eight seasons as a player in the AFL, Gruden completed 1,673-of-2,775 passes (60.3 percent) for 21,578 yards with 398 touchdowns and 99 interceptions. In addition to his time with Orlando, he spent six seasons (1991-96) at quarterback for the Tampa Bay Storm, winning four AFL titles and being named MVP of Arena Bowl VII in 1993. He was also named the 1992 AFL Most Valuable Player and was honored with induction into the AFL Hall of Fame in 1999.

Gruden played quarterback for four seasons for former Redskins draft pick Howard Schnellenberger at the University of Louisville (1985-88) and was a two-time team MVP.

Gruden was born March 4, 1967, in Tiffin, Ohio. He and his wife, Sherry, have three sons — J.J., Joey and Jack — and a grandson, Trey.

## NOTES FROM LAST GAME

» The Washington Redskins dropped a 40-16 decision to the New York Giants at FedExField on Sunday afternoon.

» Redskins recorded a pair of two-point conversions on back-to-back scoring drives. It is the first time the Redskins have scored a pair of two-point conversions in a single game. The last time Washington completed a two-point conversion was Dec. 26, 2015 against the Eagles.

» Quarterback Josh Johnson made his Redskins debut and completed 11-of-16 pass attempts for 195 yards and one touchdown for a passer rating of 104.9. Johnson threw a 79-yard touchdown pass in the fourth quarter. The score was a career long touchdown pass for Johnson and his first touchdown pass since throwing a 23-yard touchdown pass on Dec. 4, 2011 as a member of the Tampa Bay Buccaneers.

» The game marks Johnson's first game played since Dec 22, 2013 when he was a member of the Cincinnati Bengals. In that game, he recorded three rushing yards on four attempts.

» Johnson recorded 45 rushing yards on seven attempts (6.4 avg.) and one rushing touchdown. It is the first time a Redskins player has recorded a rushing touchdown and passed for a touchdown in the same game since Kirk Cousins finished with two rushing touchdowns and a touchdown pass against the Minnesota Vikings in Week 10 of the 2017 season.

» Wide Receiver Jamison Crowder finished with a game high 87 receiving yards (43.5 avg.) with two receptions and a career long touchdown catch for 79 yards.

» Tight End Vernon Davis finished with four receptions for 31 yards (7.8 avg.).

» Wide Receiver Josh Doctson hauled in four receptions for a single game career high 84 yards (21.0 avg.)

» Safety Ha Ha Clinton-Dix tied a team high seven tackles (five solo) and recorded one pass defended.

» Linebacker Mason Foster finished with six tackles (four solo) and an interception. Foster posted his second interception of the season and it is his first time recording multiple interceptions in one season since 2013 when he finished with a career-season high of three interceptions as a member of the Tampa Bay Buccaneers.

» Linebacker Shaun Dion Hamilton recorded a career-high seven tackles (five solo) and added one quarterback hit.

» Linebacker Ryan Kerrigan made his 125th consecutive regular season start. The streak is the longest active streak among active NFL linebackers. Kerrigan has not missed a start in his NFL career.

» Kerrigan finished with six tackles (four solo), two tackles for a loss and two quarterback hits and one sack for a 14-yard loss. With the sack, Kerrigan has now recorded at least 8.5 or more sacks for a seventh-consecutive season. He becomes the 13th player in NFL history to accomplish the feat since sacks became an official statistic in 1982.

» Kerrigan (80.5) is now two sacks shy of passing Charles Mann (82.0) for No. 2 on the all-time franchise list.

» Kerrigan remains as one of six NFL players (and only three non-quarterbacks) to have started every game since the start of the 2011 season (Brandon Carr, Patrick Peterson, Philip Rivers, Matt Ryan and Matthew Stafford).

» Cornerback Josh Norman collected one tackle for loss and two passes defended. Norman has now recorded 18 games in his career in which he has registered at least two passes defended. He also recorded two passes defended in Week 9 against the Atlanta Falcons.

» Defensive lineman Daron Payne recorded a sack and now has 5.0 sacks on the season. With the sack, the Redskins have now recorded consecutive seasons with at least three or more players with five or more sacks since the 1991-92 seasons.

» Punter Tress Way (36) recorded three punts inside the 20 yard line and set a new single season franchise record since the statistic

began being tracked in 1976. Way was the 2018 league leader entering the day.

» Way (345) registered eight punts to take sole possession of third on the Redskins all-time list, passing Sammy Baugh (338) and Pat Richter (338).

## THE OPPONENT



The Jacksonville Jaguars enter the game having lost eight of their last nine games after starting the season 3-1. Head Coach Doug Marrone is in his second full season with the team and is 15-16 in his tenure in Jacksonville. Marrone also owns a career mark of 30-33 as a head coach.

The quarterback position has experienced a lot of turnover, with Blake Bortles and Cody Kessler rotating throughout the year. Bortles entered the season as the starter, but has struggled, going 223-for-369 for 2,572 yards, 13 touchdowns and 10 interceptions in 11 games. Kessler is 64-for-97 for 546 yards, two touchdowns and one interception in three games.

Running back T.J. Yeldon has stepped up on offense to fill in for running back Leonard Fournette for seven games this year. Yeldon leads the team with 890 yards from scrimmage, as well as a team high in rushing yards with 408. Yeldon also has tallied five combined touchdowns this season. Fournette has been effective when he's played, with 350 yards rushing and four touchdowns, while also tallying 139 yards and a touchdown through the air in six games.

Wide receiver Dede Westbrook has been the most effective receiver on the team, registering 641 yards on 53 receptions and recording a team high five receiving touchdowns. Donte Moncrief has provided a one-two punch with Westbrook, notching 42 receptions for 604 yards and three touchdowns this year.

The Jaguars defense has been one of the bright spots of the team this season and have proven to be a challenging force. Up front, defensive ends Calais Campbell and Yannick Ngakoue have feasted on opposing quarterbacks, with seven sacks each and a combined 25 tackles for loss. Campbell has also recorded 55 tackles (39 solo) and two passes defended, while Ngakoue has 19 tackles and a team high 25 quarterback hits.

Cornerback Jalen Ramsey has maintained his status as one of the top defensive backs in the NFL. Ramsey has 53 tackles (50 solo), three interceptions and 10 passes defended this season. The Jaguars defense has tallied 10 interceptions combined and cornerback A.J. Bouye has been a strong pairing with Ramsey, notching 49 tackles (42 solo), eight passes defended and an interception.

Kicker Josh Lambo is 19-for-21 from field goal range this season, including a career long of 57 yards. Lambo now owns a career field goal percentage of 85.7% over his four year NFL career.

## DOUG MARRONE



Doug Marrone was named the fifth head coach of the Jaguars on Jan. 9, 2017 after previously serving as the team's interim head coach for the final two games of the 2016 season.

Marrone was originally hired as the team's assistant head coach-offense/offensive line coach on Jan. 20, 2015, following a two-year stint as the head coach for the Buffalo Bills (2013-14).

In his first full season as the team's head coach, Marrone finished the 2017 regular season with a 10-6 record, which was tied for the league's biggest win/loss improvement (+7) among first-year head coaches (tied with the Rams' Sean McVay).

Marrone led the team to an AFC South division title, which was the team's first division title since winning the AFC Central in 1999. The Jaguars finished the 2017 season with the top-ranked rushing offense (141.4 yards per game) and the league's best pass defense (169.0 passing yards allowed per game) en route to their first playoff berth in a decade. Under Marrone's tutelage, the Jaguars hosted a playoff game for the first time in 18 years, defeating the Buffalo Bills, 10-3, in the AFC Wild Card. The team advanced to the AFC Championship for the first time since 1999 after defeating the Pittsburgh Steelers, 45-42, in the AFC Divisional round, ultimately falling to the New England Patriots, 20-24.

Marrone's 2017 squad featured six Pro Bowl selections (CB A.J. Bouye, DE Calais Campbell, DT Malik Jackson, DE Yannick Ngakoue, CB Jalen Ramsey and LB Telvin Smith), while Bouye (second-team), Campbell (first-team), Ramsey (first-team) and Smith (second-team) were all named to the AP All-Pro teams.

In 2016, Marrone's offensive line allowed 34 sacks, 17 fewer than the previous season (51) and 37 fewer than in 2014 (71). The Jaguars' 34 sacks allowed were the fewest sacks allowed by the team since it yielded 31 sacks in 2007. In 2017, the Jaguars set a franchise record with 24 sacks allowed.

In his first season with the Jaguars in 2015, Marrone helped the offensive line provide protection for QB Blake Bortles, who set single-season franchise records with 355 completions, 606 pass attempts, 4,428 yards and 35 touchdowns. In addition, Marrone's squad blocked for rookie RB T.J. Yeldon, who accounted for 740 rushing yards and 279 receiving yards in 2015, becoming the first Jaguars rookie to surpass 1,000 scrimmage yards since Maurice Jones-Drew (1,377) in 2006. Yeldon also placed third among AFC RBs in 2016 with 84.9 scrimmage yards per game.

Prior to joining the Jaguars, Marrone compiled a 15-17 mark as the head coach of the Bills, including a 9-7 mark in 2014, the team's most wins since 2004. He became only the third coach in Bills history to win 15 games in his first two seasons (Marv Levy, 19; Wade Phillips, 21). The Bills had six Pro Bowl selections during Marrone's two seasons.

Marrone began his coaching career in 1992 at Cortland (N.Y.) State as the school's tight ends coach before stints as the offensive line coach at U.S. Coast Guard Academy (1993) and Northeastern University in 1994. A native of Bronx, N.Y., Marrone was a sixth-round draft pick of the Los Angeles Raiders in 1986 and played two years in the NFL. He played with the Miami Dolphins in 1987 and with the Saints in 1989. He also had playing stints with Pittsburgh, Dallas and Minnesota before closing his career with the NFL Europe's London Monarchs from 1991-92. Marrone was a three-year-letterman at Syracuse. He returned to Syracuse and graduated in 1991 with a degree in liberal arts.

## LAST MEETING

### Redskins 41, Jaguars 10

LANDOVER, Md. -- Robert Griffin III hobbled through the Washington Redskins' locker room on crutches, the kind of scene that has become so familiar.

The franchise player was hurt again Sunday, dislocating his left ankle in the first quarter of a 41-10 win over the Jacksonville Jaguars. The best-case scenario might have him playing again by Thanksgiving, but there's more than a decent chance he's taken his last snap of the season.

When Robert Griffin injured his ankle on Sunday, he said he looked down and knew something was wrong and was in excruciating pain, writes John Keim.

A disappointing offensive line should be the main reason to disappoint fans who want rookie Blake Bortles to be the Jaguars' starting quarterback, writes Michael DiRocco.

X-rays and an MRI will offer more specifics, but the Redskins for now belong to Kirk Cousins, who looked more comfortable in new coach Jay Gruden's offense than Griffin ever did. Cousins completed his first 12 passes and finished 22 of 33 for 250 yards and a pair of touchdowns against the woeful Jaguars.

This was truly a next-man-up game for the Redskins [1-1]. After wide receiver DeSean Jackson left in the first quarter with a sprained AC joint in his left shoulder -- he's hopeful of playing next week -- Ryan Grant (five catches) and Andre Roberts (four) picked up the slack. Niles Paul, playing for sidelined tight end Jordan Reed (hamstring), had a touchdown catch and set career highs with eight catches for 99 yards.

And the defense dominated. Ryan Kerrigan had four sacks, and the team as a whole had 10 -- both tying franchise records. Washington didn't let the Jaguars past midfield until the final two minutes of the first half and took a 21-0 lead on a team that, combined with the previous week, allowed 55 unanswered points until Chad Henne hit Mercedes Lewis for a 63-yard score with 1:40 to go in the second quarter.

The Jaguars gained 148 total yards -- and 117 came on two plays. They are 0-2 for the third consecutive season.

The Redskins ended a nine-game regular-season losing streak -- the second-longest in franchise history -- and gave Gruden his first win as an NFL head coach, but the future is cloudy because of the health of their two most dynamic playmakers.

Griffin has been trying to learn to be more of a pocket-passer under Gruden, but he was hurt while being his typical RG III self. He said his ankle got stuck in the ground as he made a leaping, across-the-body throw near the sideline and tumbled awkwardly out of bounds. The pass was caught by Jackson for an 11-yard gain.

It was the latest setback for a promising but injury-marred career. Griffin missed all or part of four games in his record-setting rookie season of 2012 due to various injuries, including a torn right ACL that led to reconstructive knee surgery. He tore the same ACL in college at Baylor.

Two plays after Griffin was hurt, Cousins hit fullback Darrel Young for a 20-yard touchdown pass for the game's first score.

On the Redskins' next series, Jackson landed on his shoulder after getting tangled with safety Josh Evans on an incomplete pass. The three-time Pro Bowl receiver was the Redskins' prized free agency acquisition this year, signing a three-year, \$24 million contract with \$16 million guaranteed after getting cut by the Eagles.

Nevertheless, the Redskins soon had a three-touchdown lead after a pair of 1-yard touchdown runs by Alfred Morris. Morris finished with 85 yards on 22 carries on a day of mixed emotions at Washington's home opener.


### COACH MEDIA AVAILABILITY NOTES

## 2018 DRAFT RECAP

### TEAM DRAFT NOTES

» Dating back to 2011, the Redskins have now selected at least seven players in eight consecutive drafts for the first time since the league adopted the seven-round format in 1994.

» Including their 10 selections in the 2017 NFL Draft, the Redskins have now selected eight or more players in back-to-back drafts for only the third time since the NFL adopted the seven-round format in 1994, including instances in 2011-12, 2014-15 and 2017-18.

» The Redskins made two trades during the draft. On Day 2, the Redskins sent the Nos. 44 and 142 overall picks to the San Francisco 49ers for the Nos. 59 and 74 overall selections. On Day 3, the team traded the Nos. 205 and 231 picks to the Los Angeles Rams for the Nos. 197 and 256 selections.

» Of the Redskins' eight selections, seven were made with picks acquired by trade, including draft-day trades with San Francisco (RB Derrius Guice and T Geron Christian) and the Los Angeles Rams (LB Shaun Dion Hamilton and WR Trey Quinn), an offseason trade with Denver (S Troy Apke and DL Tim Settle) and a 2017 preseason trade with the Rams (CB Greg Stroman).

» The Redskins' seven selections with picks acquired by trades are the team's most since 2011 (eight). The only player selected by Washington with one of the team's original picks was DL Daron Payne with the No. 13 overall selection.

» The Redskins have selected at least four players with picks acquired via trade in each of the last five drafts. It is the team's longest such stretch since a five-draft span from 1985-89.

» The Redskins selected two pairs of college teammates in the same draft for the first time since 2012.

» The Redskins have now selected at least one pair of college teammates in six of the last eight drafts (Nebraska's Roy Helu Jr., DeJon Gomes and Niles Paul in 2011; SMU's Josh LeRibeus and Richard Crawford and Iowa's Adam Gettis and Jordan Bernstine in 2012; Florida State's Chris Thompson and Brandon Jenkins in 2013; Arkansas' Martrell Spaight and Tevin Mitchell in 2015; Alabama's Jonathan Allen and Ryan Anderson in 2017; Alabama's Daron Payne and Shaun Dion Hamilton and Virginia Tech's Tim Settle and Greg Stroman in 2018).

» The 2018 NFL Draft marks the sixth time the Redskins have selected a pair of teammates out of Alabama (1941, 1948, 1951, 1962 and 2017).

» The 2018 NFL Draft marks the first time the Redskins have selected a pair of teammates out of Virginia Tech.

» The Redskins have now selected a pair of college teammates from the same school in back-to-back years for the first time since

1964-65, when the team selected a pair of teammates from Arizona State in both drafts. In those drafts, the Redskins selected Pro Football Hall of Fame HB/WR Charley Taylor and G John Seedborg from Arizona State in 1964, and then added legendary TE Jerry Smith and HB Dave Estrada from the same university in 1965.

» With four selections from the University of Alabama across the 2017-18 drafts, the Redskins selected at least four players from a single school in a two-year span for the first time since selecting T Mark Doak (No. 147 overall), DB Ardell Johnson (No. 277) and G Dennis Pavelka (No. 412) from Nebraska in 1975 and selecting Nebraska DE Dean Gissler (No. 308) in 1976.

» The Redskins made multiple picks in the seventh round for the third consecutive year, marking the team's first three-year stretch with multiple seventh-round picks since selecting at least two players in that round in each of the 2010-12 NFL Drafts.

» The Redskins selected five defensive players and have now picked at least five defensive players in consecutive drafts for the first time since 1989-90, when the draft consisted of 12 rounds.

» The Redskins have now selected at least one defensive lineman in each of the last three drafts (Matt Ioannidis in 2016, Jonathan Allen in 2017 and Daron Payne and Tim Settle in 2018). It marks the first time the team has taken a defensive lineman in three straight drafts since selecting one in each of the 2000-02 drafts, when all three selections were taken in sixth round or later (Del Cowsette in 2000, Mario Monds in 2001 and Greg Scott in 2002).

» The last time the Redskins took a defensive lineman in the fifth round or earlier in three consecutive drafts was from 1991-93 (Bobby Wilson in 1991, Shane Collins in 1992 and Sterling Palmer in 1993).

» All eight of the Redskins' draft picks played their collegiate careers in the Football Bowl Subdivision, marking the sixth straight year the team's entire draft class had played at the FBS level. The last Redskins draft pick to play in the Football Championship Subdivision was South Dakota's Tom Compton (2012).

» Seven of the eight members of the Redskins' draft class played at schools in "Power Five" conferences.

» The Redskins selected three players from the Southeastern Conference, three players from the Atlantic Coast Conference, and one player each from the Big Ten and American Athletic Conferences. The SEC leads all conferences with 14 of the Redskins' 43 selections since 2014, followed by the ACC with 10 selections.

### DL DARON PAYNE (RD. 1, NO. 13)

» Payne was the 467th selection made by the Redskins in the Common Draft era (since 1967) and the 29th first-round selection in that time frame. He is the 60th first-round selection by the Redskins all-time since the institution of the draft in 1936.

» Payne's selection marks the second straight year in which the Redskins have selected a defensive player with their first selection of the draft (DL Jonathan Allen in 2017). The last time the Redskins selected defensive players with their first selection in consecutive drafts was in the 2013-14 drafts, in which the team selected CB David Amerson and LB Trent Murphy, respectively (both in the second round).

» With the first-round selections of Allen and Payne across the 2017-18 drafts, the Redskins have now selected a defensive player in the first round of consecutive drafts for the first time since 2004 (S Sean Taylor) and 2005 (CB Carlos Rogers).

» The selections of Payne and Allen – both University of Alabama products – in the first round of back-to-back years marks the first time the Redskins have selected players from the same school in the first round of consecutive drafts in the Common Draft era. It is the second such occurrence in the team's full draft history, including the selections of Oklahoma's George Thomas and Leon Heath in the 1950 and 1951 drafts, respectively.

» Payne and Allen became the first set of college teammates

from the same position group selected by the same NFL franchise in consecutive first rounds since the San Francisco 49ers took Oregon defensive linemen Arik Armstead and DeForest Buckner in the 2015-16 drafts, respectively.

» Payne is the 10th defensive player selected by the Redskins in the first round since 1999, joining CB Champ Bailey (1999), LB LaVar Arrington (2000), S Sean Taylor (2004), CB Carlos Rogers (2005), S LaRon Landry (2007), DE/LB Brian Orakpo (2009), LB Ryan Kerrigan (2011) and DL Jonathan Allen (2017). Nine of the 10 defensive players selected by the Redskins in the first round in that time frame have earned at least one Pro Bowl selection during their career. The lone exception – Allen – was limited to five games by a season-ending Lisfranc injury as a rookie last year.

» Payne's selection marks the sixth time in the Common Draft era that the Redskins have selected a defensive lineman in the first round, joining Jonathan Allen (2017), Ryan Kerrigan (2011), Brian Orakpo (2009, transitioned to linebacker in 2010), Kenard Lang (1997) and Bobby Wilson (1991). The Redskins also selected Tracy Rocker (1989, third round), Markus Koch (1986, second round), Bob Slater (1984, second round), Duncan McColl (1977, fourth round) and Bill Brundige (1970, second round) with the team's first selections of each of the drafts listed.

» With the selections of Payne and Allen, the Redskins have now used first-round selections on defensive linemen in consecutive drafts for the first time in the Common Draft era.

» Payne is the 24th player from the University of Alabama selected by the Redskins all-time, joining B Riley Smith (1936), B Charley Holm (1939), E Sandy Sanford (1940), T Fred Davis (1941), G Ed Hickerson (1941), G Tony Leon (1943), B Bobby Jenkins (1945), T Fay Mills (1946), B Harry Gilmer (1948), B Lowell Tew (1948), T Dick Flowers (1949), E Ed White (1950), B Eddie Salem (1951), C Elliot Speed (1951), B Billy Hicks (1956), T Billy Neighbors (1962), E Tommy Brooker (1962), DB Steve Higginbotham (1972), DT Thomas Rayam (1990), T Chris Samuels (2000), G Arie Kouandjio (2015), DL Jonathan Allen (2017) and LB Ryan Anderson (2017).

» Payne's selection at No. 13 marks the fifth-highest the Redskins have selected a player from the University of Alabama, trailing B Harry Gilmer (No. 1 in 1948), B Riley Smith (No. 2 in 1936), T Chris Samuels (No. 3 in 2000) and B Lowell Tew (No. 4 in 1948).

» Payne is the eighth Southeastern Conference product selected by the Redskins in the first round in the Common Draft era. The Redskins have now selected an SEC product in the first round of consecutive drafts for the first time since 1999 (Georgia CB Champ Bailey) and 2000 (Alabama T Chris Samuels).

» Payne becomes the third player selected by the Redskins all-time with the No. 13 overall pick, joining FB Ray McDonald (1967) and DE/LB Brian Orakpo (2009).

### RB DERRIUS GUICE (RD. 2, NO. 59)

» Guice was the 468th selection made by the Redskins in the Common Draft era (since 1967) and the 38th second-round selection in that time frame. He is the 56th second-round selection by the Redskins all-time since the institution of the draft in 1936.

» Guice became the first offensive player selected by the Redskins in the second round since the team selected three offensive players in the second round of the 2008 NFL Draft.

» Prior to Guice's selection, the Redskins had selected a defensive player with their last six second-round picks, including the selections of LB Ryan Anderson (2017), S Su'a Cravens (2016), LB Preston Smith (2015), LB Trent Murphy (2014), CB David Amerson (2013) and DL Jarvis Jenkins (2011). [Note: The team did not make a second-round selection in 2012.] The six consecutive second-round picks on defensive players prior to Guice represented the longest stretch used by the Redskins on one side of the ball in the second round in the Common Draft era.

» Guice becomes the first running back selected by the Redskins in the second round since the team drafted Iowa's Ladell Bet-

ts with the No. 56 overall pick in 2002.

» Dating back to 2011, the Redskins have now selected a running back in eight consecutive drafts, the team's longest stretch since taking a running back in nine consecutive years across the 1983-91 drafts, which each consisted of 12 rounds.

» Guice is the 12th LSU product selected by the Redskins all-time, joining E Charlie Webb (1946), B Red Knight (1947), E Charlie Webb (1947), B Dan Sandifer (1948), T Ray Potter (1952), B Vince Gonzales (1956), E Billy Shoemaker (1959), RB Bob Brunet (1968), TE Robert Royal (2002), S LaRon Landry (2007) and LB Perry Riley (2010).

» Guice becomes the first LSU product selected by the Redskins in the second round in franchise history. His selection marks the fourth-highest the Redskins have selected a player from LSU, trailing S LaRon Landry's selection at No. 6 overall in 2007, B Red Knight's selection at No. 17 overall in 1947 and B Dan Sandifer's selection at No. 28 overall in 1948.

» Including the selections DL Jonathan Allen and LB Ryan Anderson in 2017 and the selections of DL Da'Ron Payne and Guice in 2018, the Redskins have selected four players from the Southeastern Conference with their four most-recent first- and second-round picks. It marks the first time the Redskins have taken four players from the same conference with four consecutive first- or second-round picks in the Common Draft era.

» Guice becomes the sixth player selected by the Redskins all-time with the No. 59 overall pick, joining T Roy Young (1938), T Bob Hendren (1946), T Hank Harris (1947), B Gary Lowe (1956) and FB Jim Snowden (1964).

» Guice was selected with a pick acquired by the Redskins in a draft day trade in which the Redskins sent the Nos. 44 and 142 overall picks to San Francisco in exchange for the Nos. 59 and 75 overall selections. It marked the Redskins first selection using an acquired pick in the 2018 NFL Draft. The No. 59 overall selection originally belonged to the New Orleans Saints, who traded the pick to San Francisco during the 2017 NFL Draft for the right to select 2017 Offensive Rookie of the Year Alvin Kamara.

### T GERON CHRISTIAN (RD. 3, NO. 74)

» Christian was the 469th selection made by the Redskins in the Common Draft era (since 1967) and the 35th third-round selection in that time frame. He is the 65th third-round selection by the Redskins all-time since the institution of the draft in 1936.

» Christian became the first offensive lineman selected by the Redskins in the third round since the team selected two linemen – T Morgan Moses and G/C Spencer Long – in the third round of the 2014 NFL Draft. Those two players combined to appear in 96 regular season games with 80 starts for the Redskins across the 2014-17 campaigns.

» Christian became the ninth offensive lineman selected by the Redskins in the first three rounds since 2000. Three of the offensive linemen selected in that timespan (Chris Samuels in 2000, Trent Williams in 2010 and Brandon Scherff in 2015) have combined for 14 career Pro Bowl appearances.

» Christian is the fifth player from Louisville selected by the Redskins all-time, joining T Ron Petty (1961), TE Jamie Asher (1995), LB Robert McCune (2005) and LB Josh Harvey-Clemons (2017).

» With Christian's selection in 2018 and the seventh-round selection of LB Josh Harvey-Clemons in 2017, the Redskins have now selected a Louisville product in consecutive drafts for the first time in team history.

» Christian became the first Louisville product selected by the Redskins in the third round in franchise history. His selection at No. 74 marks the highest the Redskins have selected a player from Louisville, surpassing TE Jamie Asher's No. 137 overall selection in the 1995 NFL Draft.

## 2018 DRAFT RECAP (CONT.)

» Christian became the fourth player selected by the Redskins all-time with the No. 74 overall pick, joining G Marcel Saunders (1936), E Russ Brown (1964) and G Paul Siever (1992).

### DB TROY APKE (RD. 4, NO. 109)

» Apke was the 470th selection made by the Redskins in the Common Draft era (since 1967) and the 34th fourth-round selection in that time frame. He is the 49th fourth-round selection by the Redskins all-time since the institution of the draft in 1936.

» Apke's selection with the No. 109 overall pick marks the highest the Redskins have selected a safety since selecting LaRon Landry with the No. 6 overall pick in the 2007 NFL Draft. (Note: Su'a Cravens was initially selected as a linebacker with the No. 53 overall pick in 2016).

» Apke became the second safety selected by the Redskins in the fourth round in the past two years after the team selected Montae Nicholson with the No. 123 overall pick in the 2017 NFL Draft. Apke and Nicholson are both natives of Allegheny County, Pennsylvania, as Apke played his high school career at Mt. Lebanon High School and Nicholson completed his prep career at Gateway High School, approximately 25 miles away.

» The 2017-18 drafts mark the Redskins' first time selecting the same position in the fourth round in back-to-back years since selecting linebackers Shawn Barber and Nate Stimson in the fourth round of the 1998 and 1999 NFL Drafts, respectively.

» Apke was the 22nd Penn State product selected by the Redskins all-time, joining G Johnny Jaffurs (1943), B Joe Colone (1947), B Don Bailey (1955), E Jack Faris (1958), QB Richie Lucas (1960), T Andy Stynchula (1960), G Earl Kohlhaas (1960), B Jim Kerr (1961), E Bob Mitinger (1962), B Ton Urbanik (1964), DB Paul Johnson (1970), LB James Kates (1970), LB Rich Milot (1979), LB Larry Kubin (1981), LB Andre Collins (1990), G Paul Siever (1992), WR Terry Smith (1992), C Greg Huntington (1993), T Andre Johnson (1996), LB LaVar Arrington (2000) and RB Evan Royster (2011).

» Penn State's 22 all-time selections by the Redskins are the fourth-most of any program, trailing Notre Dame (34), USC (30) and Alabama (24). Their 12 selections by the Redskins in the Common Draft era are tied with Nebraska for the most in that timeframe.

» Apke became the first defensive player from Penn State selected by the Redskins since selecting three-time Pro Bowl linebacker LaVar Arrington with the No. 2 overall pick in the 2000 NFL Draft.

» Apke becomes the sixth player selected by the Redskins all-time with the No. 109 overall pick, joining G Henry Bartos (1938), T Monte Moncrief (1946), RB Jamie Morris (1988), DB Rico Labbe (1990) and QB Sage Rosenfels (2001).

### DL TIM SETTLE (RD. 5, NO. 163)

» Settle was the 471st selection made by the Redskins in the Common Draft era (since 1967) and the 49th fifth-round selection in that time frame. He is the 74th fifth-round selection by the Redskins all-time since the institution of the draft in 1936.

» Settle was the second defensive lineman selected by the Redskins in the fifth round in the past three drafts. The team selected DL Matt Ioannidis with the No. 152 overall pick in the 2016 NFL Draft.

» With the selection of Settle and the first-round selection of DL Da'Ron Payne, the Redskins have now selected two defensive linemen in the same draft for the first time since selecting Anthony Montgomery and Kedric Golston in the 2006 NFL Draft.

» Settle played his prep career at Stonewall Jackson H.S. in Manassas, Va., approximately 25 miles from team headquarters in Ashburn, Va. Including the selection of Stone Bridge H.S.'s Jonathan Allen last year, the Redskins have now selected players from the Northern Virginia metro area in back-to-back drafts.

» Settle was the seventh Virginia Tech product selected by the

Redskins all-time, joining C Buzz Nutter (1953), E Tom Petty (1955), TE Ken Barefoot (1968), T Derek Smith (1999), DB Kyshoen Jarrett (2015) and CB Kendall Fuller (2016).

» Settle became the third Virginia Tech product selected by the Redskins in the last four drafts, with all three picks coming on the defensive side of the ball.

» Settle became the fourth player selected by the Redskins all-time with the No. 163 overall pick, joining T Doug Conaway (1952), TE Danzell Lee (1985) and DE Dexter Nottage (1994).

### LB SHAUN DION HAMILTON (RD. 6, 197)

» Hamilton was the 472nd selection made by the Redskins in the Common Draft era (since 1967) and the 57th sixth-round selection in that time frame. He is the 83rd sixth-round selection by the Redskins all-time since the institution of the draft in 1936.

» Hamilton was the second linebacker from Alabama selected by the Redskins in the last two drafts, joining LB Ryan Anderson (No. 49 overall in 2017). Including the selections of DL Jonathan Allen and DL Da'Ron Payne in the 2017 and 2018 drafts, respectively, the Redskins have now selected a defensive lineman and linebacker from Alabama in back-to-back drafts.

» Hamilton was the 25th player from the University of Alabama selected by the Redskins all-time, joining B Riley Smith (1936), B Charley Holm (1939), E Sandy Sanford (1940), T Fred Davis (1941), G Ed Hickerson (1941), G Tony Leon (1943), B Bobby Jenkins (1945), T Fay Mills (1946), B Harry Gilmer (1948), B Lowell Tew (1948), T Dick Flowers (1949), E Ed White (1950), B Eddie Salem (1951), C Elliot Speed (1951), B Billy Hicks (1956), T Billy Neighbors (1962), E Tommy Brooker (1962), DB Steve Higginbotham (1972), DT Thomas Rayam (1990), T Chris Samuels (2000), G Arie Kouandjio (2015), DL Jonathan Allen (2017), LB Ryan Anderson (2017) and DL Da'Ron Payne (2018).

» Alabama's 25 all-time selections by the Redskins are third-most from any school in franchise history, trailing only Notre Dame (34) and USC (30).

» Hamilton becomes the third player selected by the Redskins all-time with the No. 197 overall pick, joining T Len Vella (1962) and QB Gus Frerotte (1994).

### DB GREG STROMAN (RD. 7, NO. 241)

» Stroman was the 473rd selection made by the Redskins in the Common Draft era (since 1967) and the 62nd seventh-round selection in that time frame. He is the 93rd seventh-round selection by the Redskins all-time since the institution of the draft in 1936.

» Stroman was the eighth Virginia Tech product selected by the Redskins all-time, joining C Buzz Nutter (1953), E Tom Petty (1955), TE Ken Barefoot (1968), T Derek Smith (1999), DB Kyshoen Jarrett (2015), CB Kendall Fuller (2016) and DL Tim Settle (2018).

» With Stroman's selection, the Redskins selected teammates from Virginia Tech in a single draft for the first time in team history.

» In addition to playing collegiately with fifth-round pick Tim Settle, Stroman played his prep career with Settle at Stonewall Jackson H.S. in Manassas, Va., approximately 25 miles from team headquarters in Ashburn, Va.

» Stroman was the third Virginia Tech defensive back selected by the Redskins in the last four drafts, joining the selections of DB Kyshoen Jarrett (2015) and CB Kendall Fuller (2016).

» The Redskins have now selected a cornerback in the seventh round in back-to-back years, including the selection of Joshua Holsey in 2017.

» Stroman becomes the third player selected by the Redskins all-time with the No. 241 overall pick, joining T George Tolford (1961) and WR Lawrence McCullough (1980).

### WR TREY QUINN (RD. 7, NO. 256)

» Quinn was the 474th selection made by the Redskins in the Common Draft era (since 1967) and the 63rd seventh-round selection in that time frame. He is the 94th seventh-round selection by the Redskins all-time since the institution of the draft in 1936.

» Quinn was selected with the final pick of the 2018 NFL Draft, a selection now known as “Mr. Irrelevant.” The nomenclature began in 1976, and is part of “Irrelevant Week,” described thusly by the organizers’ website: “Over the past 40 years, Irrelevant Week has become a much-anticipated and beloved celebration honoring football’s underdog, while also making charitable contributions to the community. Through Irrelevant Week, the organization has donated more than \$1 million to charities over the past three decades. Previous beneficiaries include the American Cancer Society, Big Brothers Big Sisters, Goodwill Industries, YMCA, Special Olympics, Habitat for Humanity, NFL Alumni, and the American Red Cross, among others.”

» Quinn was the second member of the Redskins to be tabbed as Mr. Irrelevant since its inception in 1976, joining Nebraska C Matt Elliott (1992). The Redskins also selected G Bo Bogovich with the last pick of the 1943 NFL Draft prior to the adoption of the pick’s nickname in 1976.

» Quinn was the eighth SMU product selected by the Redskins all-time, joining T Sid Halliday (1945), E Gabby Martin (1945), C Dick Hightower (1952), E Ben White (1952), WR Aldrick Robinson (2011), G Josh LeRibeus (2012) and CB Richard Crawford (2012).

» The Redskins selected a total of four SMU products from 1936-2010, including two selections from the school in each of the 1945 and 1952 NFL Drafts. Including Quinn, the Redskins have now selected four SMU products in the last eight drafts since 2011.

» Quinn became the second player selected by the Redskins all-time with the No. 256 overall pick, joining G Ed Pucci (1953).

## 2018 SUPPLEMENTAL DRAFT RECAP

### CB ADONIS ALEXANDER (RD. 6)

» Alexander was the fifth selection made by the Redskins from the Supplemental Draft (since 1977) and the first sixth-round selection in that time frame.

» Including the NFL Draft and Supplemental Draft, Alexander was the ninth Virginia Tech product selected by the Redskins all-time, joining C Buzz Nutter (1953), E Tom Petty (1955), TE Ken Barefoot (1968), T Derek Smith (1999), DB Kyshoen Jarrett (2015), CB Kendall Fuller (2016), DL Tim Settle (2018) and CB Greg Stroman (2018).

» With Alexander’s selection, the Redskins selected teammates from Virginia Tech in a single draft year for the first time in team history.

» Including combined picks in the NFL Draft and Supplemental Draft, Alexander was the fourth Virginia Tech defensive back selected joining the selections of DB Kyshoen Jarrett (2015), CB Kendall Fuller (2016), Greg Stroman (2018) from the NFL Draft.

» The Redskins have now selected a cornerback for the first time in the Supplemental Draft. Alexander becomes the second player from the college ranks and second defensive player selected joining DE Jeremy Jarmon (2009).

» With the selection of Alexander in the Supplemental Draft and the selection of his Virginia Tech teammates DL Tim Settle and CB Greg Stroman in the NFL Draft, marks the first time that all three players picked in the same draft year played on the same defensive unit in college before becoming eligible for either draft.

## JOSH JOHNSON

The Redskins signed 10-year veteran Josh Johnson to provide depth when quarterback Colt McCoy went down with a leg injury. After an early deficit against the New York Giants, Johnson made his first appearance on an NFL field since 2013 in relief of quarterback Mark Sanchez.

Johnson provided a spark for the Redskins, after falling down 40-0. The veteran threw his first touchdown pass since 2011 on a 79-yard career long pass to Jamison Crowder. Johnson also ran for his first career rushing touchdown and totaled a team leading 45 yards rushing in the game.

A 2008 5th round pick out of the University of San Diego, Johnson has been a member of 13 NFL organizations and nine different 53-man rosters, playing in games for the Tampa Bay Buccaneers, Cleveland Browns and Cincinnati Bengals before his debut in Washington. Johnson has tallied five starts in his career and 20 games in total, going 107-for-193 for 1,237 yards, six touchdowns and 11 interceptions, while also rushing for 319 yards on 51 attempts.

The 32-year old is familiar with Head Coach Jay Gruden, having spent time with him while with the Cincinnati Bengals and Tampa Bay Buccaneers. It is also not the first time Johnson has come in relief of Colt McCoy, having been signed by the Cleveland Browns late in 2012 after an injury to McCoy.

The Washington Redskins bolstered their depth at the running back position by signing seven-time Pro Bowler Adrian Peterson on Aug. 20 after losing second round pick Derrius Guice to a torn ACL in the first preseason game.

Peterson impressed during his workout and in his performance in the preseason and carried that over to the regular season. Against the Cardinals in Week 1, Peterson rushed for 96 yards on 26 carries and caught two passes for 70 yards. He was the only player in Week 1 to lead a team in both rushing and receiving.

In Week 3, Peterson rushed for 120 yards on 19 carries (6.3 avg.) and scored two rushing touchdowns to help the Redskins secure their first home win of the season, defeating the Green Bay Packers, 31-17. He was awarded the FedEx Ground Player of the Week Award for his efforts against Green Bay. He added 97 yards on 17 carries in the Redskins, 23-17, win over the Carolina Panthers in Week 6 and 99 yards on 24 carries in the team’s Week 7 victory over the Dallas Cowboys.

In Week 8 at the New York Giants, Peterson put on a vintage performance. He finished the game with 149 yards on 26 carries, including a 64 yard touchdown run in the fourth quarter to seal the game. He also hauled in a seven yard touchdown reception in the first quarter. Peterson scored two rushing touchdowns in Week 11 against Houston and passed Hall of Famer John Riggins for No. 6 on the NFL’s all-time list.

Peterson broke a 90 yard touchdown run in Week 13 against Philadelphia, which ranks as the longest run from scrimmage in his career and in Redskins history. Peterson passed Hall of Famer Barry Sanders for the most 50-plus yard rushing touchdowns in NFL history.

He has been selected to seven Pro Bowls and was the 2012 NFL MVP after finishing second all-time in rushing yards for a single season (2,097). The 12th-year pro currently ranks fourth all-time in yards per game (90.1), tied for fifth all-time in rushing touchdowns (106) and is ninth in rushing yards (13,148).

## CHRIS THOMPSON

Following the Week 1 win over Arizona, Head Coach Jay Gruden was asked about running back Chris Thompson's resiliency in coming back from the injury that sidelined him for the second half of the 2017 season.

"Yeah, nothing surprised me about Chris. We all know how I feel about Chris. The way he's battled back from that injury, was a testament to what kind of person he is, also the player he is. He can get open in the backfield, he protected well, obviously ran the ball well. He's a critical player for this football team."

The Redskins signed Thompson to a multi-year contract extension in Week 1 of the 2017 season, locking up the third-down back that Gruden considers the best in the NFL.

Dubbed the "Chris Army Knife" by some fans for his ability to run, catch and block, Thompson's story has been one of perseverance. At Florida State, two broken vertebrae ended his 2011 season and a knee injury ended his 2012 campaign. Shoulder surgery cut his 2013 rookie season in Washington short, he spent the majority of the 2014 season on the team's practice squad and in 2017 a knee injury caused him to miss the final six games of the season.

But Thompson's role has blossomed in recent years. Before missing the final six games of the season in 2017, Thompson was one of, if not the best receiving back in football. In 10 games he caught 39 passes for 510 yards and scored four touchdowns. He also rushed for 294 yards on 64 attempts with two rushing touchdowns. In 10 games he amassed 804 scrimmage yards. From Week 1 to Week 11 of the 2017 season, Thompson ranked first among running backs in receiving yards (510), average yards per reception (13.1) and receiving yards per game (51.0). He was tied with L.A. Chargers RB Melvin Gordon for first in receiving touchdowns (4) and was second in 25+ yard receptions (5) behind L.A. Rams RB Todd Gurley (6).

So far this season, Thompson has picked up right where he left off. In the five games he has appeared, he has registered 28 receptions for 209 receiving yards and one touchdown and has added 113 yards on the ground for a total of 322 yards from scrimmage. Thompson is tied for fifth in the NFL in receptions per game.

Thompson had a fast start to the 2018 season. In a Week 1 victory over the Arizona Cardinals, Thompson finished the game with 128 scrimmage yards. He registered 65 yards on five carries and hauled in six receptions for 63 yards, including a 13 yard touchdown reception in the first quarter, which helped the Redskins secure their opening day victory, 24-6. Thompson carried over the success to the Redskins home opener where he hauled in a career high 13 receptions for 92 yards against the Colts. He was one reception shy of tying the franchise record and two receptions shy of breaking the current record held by Roy Helu, Jr.

Thompson returned in Week 13 against Philadelphia and hauled in three receptions for 18 yards and added three receptions for 15 yards against the Giants in Week 14.

"It's great that you see the hard work pay off for somebody like Chris," Gruden said. "He's such a great kid off the field. You want to see him succeed in the worst way because he does everything exactly right the way you ask him. In practice, he takes all the reps, he works hard, never takes a play off. He's never been late one time to a meeting or a workout. He's a coach's dream, quite frankly."



## 2017 THOMPSON TIDBITS

\*\* Thompson recorded only the sixth season in franchise history with at least 275 rushing yards and at least 500 receiving yards, joining Jim Paddock (1957), Charley Taylor (1964 and 1965), Clarence Harmon (1980), Joe Washington (1981).

\*\* Thompson was one of six NFL players with at least 275 rushing yards and at least 500 receiving yards in 2017, joining Todd Gurley II, Le'Veon Bell, Alvin Kamara, Christian McCaffrey and Duke Johnson Jr. Thompson accomplished the feat in 10 games, while the other five players all appeared in at least 15 games.

\*\* Before a Week 11 contest in which he suffered a season-ending injury, Thompson led the Redskins in both rushing and receiving yards, the only player in the NFL at the time to lead a team in both categories.

\*\* Thompson's receiving average was the best by a qualified Redskins running back since Clarence Harmon (13.6) in 1979.

\*\* Thompson's 13.1 yards-per-catch average was the highest by any NFL running back with at least 35 receptions since San Francisco's Garrison Hearst in 1998 (13.7).

\*\* Thompson accrued 804 scrimmage yards on 103 combined offensive touches, averaging 7.8 scrimmage yards per touch. His 7.8-yard average was the best among qualified players in team history since the 1970 AFL-NFL merger. The mark is the fifth-best in team history dating back to the franchise's inception in 1932, trailing only Steve Bagarus (10.6 in 1945), Eddie Saenz (8.7 in 1947) and Dick Todd (8.4 in 1940 and 8.0 in 1948).

## JORDAN REED

In recent seasons, Redskins players have often extolled the ability of tight end Jordan Reed to anyone who will listen.

“As I’ve said before and said every week, I don’t know anybody who can guard that young man. When he’s on, he’s on, and it’s tough to stop. He’s the best receiving tight end in the NFL, hands down.”

- Five-time Pro Bowl tackle Trent Williams on Jordan Reed, as told to The Washington Post

The NFL officially took notice in 2016 when Reed earned his first career Pro Bowl selection, the first by a Redskins tight end since Chris Cooley in 2008. Reed joined Cooley (2007-08), Stephen Alexander (2000), Jean Fugett (1977) and Jerry Smith (1967 and 1969) as the only Redskins tight ends to earn Pro Bowl honors since the game’s inception in 1950.

Despite being limited by injury to only 12 games with eight starts in 2016, the ex-college-quarterback recorded 66 receptions for 686 yards with six receiving touchdowns. A year earlier, he compiled arguably the greatest season by a tight end in franchise history. During the 2015 regular season, Reed recorded 87 receptions for 952 yards (both team records for a tight end) with 11 receiving touchdowns, becoming the first tight end to lead the Redskins in all three categories since Fugett in 1977.

“He was a puppy when he came in here physically; now he’s filling out and he’s a bigger guy. He’s playing with a ton of confidence,” Head Coach Jay Gruden said in 2016. “We can move him around and do a lot of different things with him. He’s a smart player. He can see coverages, he can work off leverage of the defenders, he’s got big strong hands and he’s excellent after the catch. Really, the sky is the limit for Jordan. I have all of the confidence in the world that when the ball is thrown to him, he’s going to be in the right spot and make the catch. And he can beat a lot of people. He’s getting better and better, more and more confident and he’s blocking better, too. He’s a heck of a player, no doubt.”

In 62 career games with 34 starts for Washington, Reed has compiled 319 career receptions for 3,275 yards with 24 receiving touchdowns. In Week 4 of the 2016 season against Cleveland, Reed recorded his 200th career reception in his 38th career game, becoming the fastest tight end to reach 200 career receptions in NFL history, surpassing Pro Football Hall of Famer Kellen Winslow.

In Week 8 of the 2018 season, Reed hauled in his 300th reception becoming the 10th Redskin all-time to accomplish the feat and the third tight end. He also became the second fastest tight end to record 300 reception in NFL history behind Hall of Famer Kellen Winslow, Sr. (57 games).

## JAMISON CROWDER

Thirty-four wide receivers were drafted in the 2015 NFL Draft. As of the conclusion of the 2017 season, 30 of them had appeared in NFL game action. Thirteen of those players were drafted ahead of the moment when the Washington Redskins selected Jamison Crowder with the No. 105 overall selection in the fourth round.

However, only two of Crowder's classmates (Oakland's Amari Cooper and Minnesota's Stefon Diggs) have recorded more career receptions than the Duke product, who has placed himself on the NFL radar with 192 receptions for 2,240 yards and 12 receiving touchdowns in his young career.

Crowder entered his rookie season in 2015 with expectations of assuming the team's role at punt returner, but Crowder rapidly exceeded those limits and earned the team's top slot receiver role and became another weapon for the Redskins on third down.

"We had a penciled-in punt returner job for him, but for him to win the starting inside slot receiver is a testament to him and how quickly he picked it up and his production," Head Coach Jay Gruden said. "When you draft guys, you have high hopes for them, but you never expect them to be this much of a factor this early, especially fourth-fifth rounders."

In Week 5 of his sophomore campaign in 2016, Crowder ended the Redskins' 124-game punt return touchdown drought with an 85-yard touchdown at Baltimore. His punt return for touchdown was the Redskins' first since Oct. 26, 2008, when Santana Moss returned a punt 80 yards for a touchdown at Detroit.

At 23 years and 114 days old, Crowder became the youngest member of the Redskins to return a punt for a touchdown since Brian Mitchell (23 years, 35 days) at Cincinnati on Sept. 22, 1991, according to records provided by Pro Football Reference.

Crowder finished the 2016 season with a 12.1-yard punt return average, the best by a member of the Redskins since 2001. His fourth-place ranking in the NFL in punt return average was the best by a member of the Redskins since Brian Mitchell's second-place finish in 1995. The dual threat was the only player in the NFL in 2016 to catch at least 65 passes and average at least 11.0 yards per return.

On offense, Crowder's 192 receptions from 2015-17 are the second-most by a member of the Redskins in the first three years of an NFL career. Crowder has hauled in nine receptions for 79 yards and a touchdown in 2018 thus far.

## VERNON DAVIS

What does it take to have coaches, teammates and broadcasters refer to you as "The Ageless One"?

How about a 6-foot-3, 244-pound veteran registering only 3.8 percent body fat entering his 13th NFL season? What about that same man reportedly still running the 40-yard dash in the 4.4 range into his mid-30s?

For Vernon Davis, those astoundingly true facts tell only part of the story. A native of Washington, D.C., Davis came home in free agency in 2016 and has delivered 96 catches and 1,380 yards in his first three seasons in burgundy and gold. At age 32-34 in those seasons, he ranks second only to Redskins legend Jerry Smith in receptions among tight ends age 30 or older in team history and first in receiving yards, according to records provided by Pro Football Reference.

Davis took sole possession of seventh on the NFL's all-time career touchdown reception list among tight ends, passing Redskins great Jerry Smith after hauling in a 22-yard touchdown reception in the Redskins, 23-17, win vs. the Carolina Panthers in Week 6.

He now ranks in the Top 10 in NFL history in career receptions, receiving yards and receiving touchdowns by a tight end. After scoring a 53-yard touchdown against Dallas in Week 12 he tied Hall of Famer Shannon Sharpe for the sixth most touchdown receptions for a tight end in NFL history.

## RYAN KERRIGAN

With a wrestling-inspired sack celebration, linebacker Ryan Kerrigan has earned the moniker "The Showstopper" since joining the Redskins in 2011. But while it might not have the same cachet, calling the three-time Pro Bowler "Mr. Reliable" might be just as apt.

If patience is a virtue, the Redskins were virtuous in the first round of the 2011 NFL Draft, as the team opted to trade back from its No. 10 overall selection to the 16th overall pick. With the selection, the Redskins selected Kerrigan, the then-defensive end out of Purdue.

Kerrigan has started all 124 regular season games played by the Redskins since he entered the league in 2011, the longest active streak of consecutive starts by any NFL linebacker. In 2016, Kerrigan became the first member of the Redskins to start all 16 games in each of the first six seasons of an NFL career since the adoption of the 16-game schedule in 1978. In Week 4 of the 2017 season, Kerrigan became the first member of the Redskins since at least 1970 to open a career with 100 consecutive regular season starts.

The Muncie, Ind. native is only the fifth player in NFL history to open a career with at least 7.5 sacks in each of his first seven seasons, joining Jared Allen, Derrick Thomas, DeMarcus Ware and Reggie White. He also became only the fifth member of the Redskins to post multiple 10-sack seasons since 1982 (Dexter Manley, 4; Charles Mann, 4; Andre Carter, 2; Brian Orakpo, 2). He's also displayed aptitude with the ball in hands, as he has returned all three of his career interceptions for touchdowns, joining Julius Peppers and Pro Football Hall of Famer Jason Taylor as the only players in league history with 60+ sacks and three or more interception return touchdowns.

Kerrigan's impact on the Redskins has transcended football, as he was honored with the team's Walter Payton Man of the Year award in 2015. In addition to participating in numerous events through the Washington Redskins Charitable Foundation, Kerrigan welcomed 185 guests to the Grand Hyatt Washington in 2015 for his third Celebrity Waiter Night, raising more than \$100,000 for his Blitz for the Better Foundation, which provides support to seriously ill, special needs and physically challenged children throughout the Greater Washington D.C. area.

Kerrigan secured his first sack of the 2018 campaign, dropping Drew Brees for an eight yard loss in the Redskins Week 5 matchup with the Saints. Kerrigan sacked Cowboys QB Dak Prescott twice in the Redskins Week 7 matchup, including a strip sack in the fourth quarter that was scooped up by Preston Smith for a touchdown. Kerrigan passed Charles Mann for second on the Redskins all-time list of players with 2-plus sack games.

He followed up his success in the Dallas game with a 1.5 sack effort against the New York Giants in Week 8 and a one sack effort against Atlanta in Week 9. Kerrigan pushed his season sack total to 7.5 after sacking Deshaun Watson twice in Week 11.

Kerrigan split a sack in the Thanksgiving Day contest against the Cowboys and sacked Eli Manning once in Week 14 to bring his season total to 9.0. He became the 19th player in NFL history to record 9-plus sacks in five consecutive seasons since sacks became an official statistic in 1982. Kerrigan is the only Redskin to ever accomplish the feat.

With one more sack this season, Kerrigan would join Dexter Manley and Charles Mann as the only three Redskins in NFL history to record double digit sacks in four or more seasons.

# GAME RELEASE

## DJ SWEARINGER SR.

In 2017, the Washington Redskins signed four-year safety DJ Swearinger Sr. Swearinger who came to Washington after stops in Houston, Tampa Bay and Arizona and it looks like he may have found a permanent home in the Nations Capital.

Since signing with the Redskins, Swearinger has assumed a leadership role in the secondary and is one of the team's vocal leaders. He had an impressive first season with the team registering four interceptions and 10 passes defended. His four interceptions was tied for a team-high and was tied for the 12th best mark in the league.

So far this season, Swearinger has picked up right where he left off. In 13 games thus far, he has four interceptions, 10 passes defended, one sack, three forced fumbles and one fumble recovery. His four interceptions are tied for the sixth most in the NFL through Week 14. Swearinger's 10 passes defended are the fifth most by a safety in the league this year.

In the Week 2 matchup against the Indianapolis Colts, Swearinger intercepted Colts QB Andrew Luck twice, marking his second multi-interception game as a Redskin. He became the 19th player in franchise history to record multiple games with two or more interceptions. Swearinger joins Miami LB Kiko Alonso, Houston S Kareem Jackson and Seattle S Bradley McDougald as the only players this season with two or more forced fumbles and two or more interceptions.

Swearinger posted his second multiple interception game against the New York Giants in Week 8. Swearinger intercepted Eli Manning twice and is the only player in the league so far this season with two or more games with multiple interceptions. He needs one more multiple interception game to tie a single season franchise record.

## SECONDARY SPOTLIGHT

### JOSH NORMAN

When the Carolina Panthers rescinded cornerback Josh Norman's franchise tag and allowed the All-Pro defender to enter unrestricted free agency on April 20, 2016 roles instantly became reversed. The then-28-year-old lockdown corner became the subject of teams trying to lock down his services.

The Redskins mobilized quickly, dispatching members of the Redskins' coaching staff on April 22 to pick up Norman and his family from his Carolina home and bring them to team headquarters. The group arrived back in Ashburn early that afternoon, and after the full press and a family vote, Norman was a member of the Washington Redskins by 9:30 p.m.

"It was an exciting 24 hours there and we're happy as heck to get him," Head Coach Jay Gruden said. "I think he's one of the premier corners in the National Football League."

Norman joined the Redskins having previously appeared in 53 regular season games with 38 starts for Carolina, recording 178 tackles (136 solo), 36 passes defended, seven interceptions (two returned for touchdowns), four forced fumbles and three fumbles recovered from 2012-15.

In 2015, Norman started all 16 regular season games and all three postseason games for the Panthers, recording career highs in interceptions (four), forced fumbles (three) and fumbles recovered (two) in addition to tying for the league lead in interceptions returned for touchdowns (two). His highly decorated 2015 campaign resulted in a myriad of honors, including All-Pro selections from both the Associated Press and Pro Football Writers Association in addition to sharing PFWA Co-Most Improved Player of the Year honors with new teammate Kirk Cousins.

Since that breakout campaign in 2015, few defensive backs have been as disruptive as the man known colloquially as "J-No."

Norman's accolades and productivity speak for themselves, but what kind of person were the Redskins getting? Gruden and the Redskins learned early in 2016.

"I've been very impressed with Josh from the day that he got here," Gruden said. "He works extremely hard. He's got a great energy every single time that he walks out onto the field, and he's the last one off the field. He's attentive at meetings - he's excellent."

Norman had his best performance of the 2018 season against his former team in Week 6. He finished the game with five tackles (four solo), an interception, one forced fumble and one pass defended. He was the first Redskin since Kendall Fuller (Week 3 of 2017) to record an interception and a forced fumble in a game.

In Week 13 against Philadelphia, Norman recorded his third interception of the season and is now one shy from tying his single season high

### FLIGHT MARSHALS

In 2016, the Redskins made a major splash in their secondary, adding free agent Josh Norman to the group. A year later, the unit found additional leadership in both the coaching and player ranks.

In January of 2017, the Redskins named Torrian Gray as the team's Defensive Backs Coach after he spent the previous 11 seasons producing NFL defensive backs at Virginia Tech (2006-15) and Florida (2016). Two months later, the Redskins signed safety D.J. Swearinger on the first day of unrestricted free agency. Swearinger's swagger and Gray's emphasis on technique brought new life to a unit that has dubbed itself the "Flight Marshals."

"We control everything in the air, man," Swearinger told The Washington Post. "Like we say, man, we're going to get on this flight, it's going to be a long flight, we're going to keep everybody in their seat belts and we're going to keep the red light on. The wide receivers, you gotta stay in your seat belt."

The unit's signature celebration was on display against the 49ers in Week 6. After a game-sealing interception with three seconds remaining, Swearinger and his Flight Marshal teammates mimed a security screening/frisking.

No matter the nickname, Swearinger's impact has been immediately felt by Redskins coaches and players. He was named the team's defensive captain prior to ever stepping foot on the field for the Redskins in a regular season game. It was proof that Swearinger's teammates believed he could back up his reputation for trash talk with a reputation for stellar play.

"It's one thing being a vocal guy, but you have to back it up with production and sound play and know what you are talking about. I've had guys before that are talkers that don't know what they are doing, but he brings both," Head Coach Jay Gruden said. "He brings an edge to him that rubs off on people."

While Swearinger and Norman - former high school teammates in Greenwood, S.C. - account for most of the spotlight and the volume among the group, the Redskins had a number of young players make important contributions in the secondary in 2017. Receiver-convert Quinton Dunbar was called upon to start in place of an injured Norman and registered a couple of critical passes defended in a win over San Francisco in Week 6. Rookie safety Montae Nicholson announced his presence in a big way in Week 3, intercepting Raiders quarterback Derek Carr on the game's first possession and later leveling and knocking wide receiver Michael Crabtree out of the game with a legal hit.



## SPOTLIGHT ON SPECIAL TEAMS

### KICKER DUSTIN HOPKINS

The Redskins surprised many in Week 2 of the 2015 season when they elected to move on from kicker Kai Forbath, who exited as the franchise leader in field goal percentage among players with at least 50 attempts, in favor of signing kicker Dustin Hopkins.

After a solid debut in 2015, Hopkins went 34-for-42 on field goal attempts in 2016, breaking Mark Moseley's record (33 in 1983) for the most field goals in a single season in team history. In Week 3 that year, he tied a team record with five field goals in a 5-for-5 performance in a victory as part of an NFC Special Teams Player of the Week and Player of the Month performance.

Beyond Hopkins' ability to boot the ball through the uprights, his ability to get it to stop and turn on a dime after 10 yards was vital to a Redskins' victory against Tampa Bay in Week 7 of the 2015 season. Hopkins delivered a perfect onside kick to start the second half of that game, ending a league-wide 0-for-24 skid on onside kick attempts to start the 2015 season. The onside kick helped jumpstart the Redskins en route to recording the largest comeback victory in franchise history.

It was only the fourth successful onside kick by the Redskins since 2000 and ended a streak of 18 unsuccessful onside kick attempts by the Redskins over the previous nine seasons.

In the Redskins Week 6 matchup against Carolina, Head Coach Jay Gruden trusted Hopkins with a 56 yard attempt instead of attempting to pin the Panthers deep in their own territory. The risk paid off as Hopkins connected on the kick, marking a new career high and tying him with Chip Lohmiller for the third longest made field goal in franchise history.

### PUNTER TRESS WAY

The Redskins spent the majority of the 2014 offseason evaluating a punting battle between newcomers Robert Malone and Blake Clingan, but the race received a darkhorse candidate when the team claimed Way off waivers from Chicago on Aug. 20 that year. Way was given 10 days to stake a claim to the punting job.

Way accomplished the feat and has since posted historically relevant numbers, earned the special teams captaincy in 2015 and been rewarded with a multi-year contract extension in 2016.

In 2014, Way's punting numbers rewarded the coaching staff's faith. Way averaged 47.5 yards per punt, the highest by a Redskins player since World War II. He finished the season averaging 47.5 yards per punt to rank fourth in team history, trailing only Sammy Baugh's full-season NFL record (51.4 yards per punt in 1940) and Baugh's 1941 and 1942 campaigns (48.7 and 48.2). Way became the first member of the Redskins to lead the NFL in punting for a season since Sam Baker in 1958 (45.4).

Throughout his career, Way has waged his field position war by dropping punts inside the 20 with regularity. In the Redskins Week 7 matchup against Dallas, Way pinned a single game career high five punts inside the 20 yard line and was a key factor in the team's, 20-17, victory at FedExField. He currently lead the league with 36 punts inside the 20 yard line. Way has already broken his previous single season record of punts inside the 20 with his 36 through 13 games. His previous high was 33 punts pinned inside the 20 yard line in 2017.

## REDSKINS 24, CARDINALS 6

**GLENDAL, Ariz.** - Alex Smith looked like his old self. So did Adrian Peterson. When the 34-year-old Smith wasn't carving up the Arizona defense, the 33-year-old Peterson was running through it. The result was a 24-6 Washington victory on Sunday, coach Jay Gruden's first win in a season opener in five tries, and it was even more dominant than the final score would indicate.

Smith and Peterson were playing their first game as Redskins and the two veterans made an impact from the start. Smith, acquired from Kansas City in the offseason to replace Kirk Cousins, completed 21 of 30 passes without an interception and had TD throws of 13 yards to Chris Thompson and 4 yards to Jordan Reed. Peterson rushed for 96 yards on 26 carries, including a 1-yard touchdown run.

Peterson, who played for Arizona a year ago and signed with Washington as a free agent on Aug. 20, finished his day with a 52-yard reception, but fumbled at the end of the play. The Redskins outgained the Cardinals 429-213 and had 30 first downs to Arizona's 14 and it was even more one-sided before the Cardinals showed some life late in the game. Washington rushed for 182 yards to Arizona's 68.

Arizona avoided a shutout when David Johnson ran 2 yards for a touchdown with 5:47 to play. Johnson, who signed a three-year, \$39 million contract extension with Arizona on Saturday night with \$30 million guaranteed, carried nine times for 37 yards and caught five passes for 30 yards. Sam Bradford, in his debut as Cardinals quarterback, was 20 of 34 for 153 yards and was intercepted once. The Redskins manhandled the Arizona defense in a dominant first half to lead 21-0 at the break. And the Arizona team under the new coaching regime was booed roundly as it left the field.

The statistics were stunningly one-sided through the first two quarters: 261 yards for the Redskins to 36 yards for the Cardinals. Smith completed 17 of 20 passes for 171 yards and two touchdowns. Bradford, meanwhile, was 3 of 7 for 11 yards. Washington had the ball for 22 minutes, 57 seconds to the Cardinals' 7:03. Arizona got two first downs on its first possession and went three-and-out the only other two times it had the ball in the first half.

Washington, meanwhile, had touchdown drives of 80, 73 and 92 yards behind a powerful rushing game and the efficient management of Smith. The first scoring drive went 80 yards in 11 plays, Smith went 13 yards to Thompson on the first play of the second quarter for the score.

After Arizona's first three-and-out, Washington used up 9:06 in a 15-play, 73-yard drive, Peterson plowing in from the 1-yard line to make it 14-0. The Cardinals went nowhere again and the Redskins took advantage of their last chance of the half. Smith completed 7 of 7 passes for 77 yards in a 10-play, 92-yard drive. Smith threw 4 yards to Reed for the touchdown and it was 21-0 with 8 seconds left in the half.

## COLTS 21, REDSKINS 9

**LANDOVER, Md.** -- Andrew Luck could recall a critical error the Indianapolis Colts made on almost every possession, some he made.

When it mattered most, he was almost perfect. Luck shook off two interceptions and capped a methodical drive with his second touchdown of the game to help the Colts beat the Washington Redskins 21-9 Sunday and pick up their first victory of the season.

Luck was 21 of 31 for 179 yards and had a TD pass in a 25th consecutive game, the longest active streak in the NFL. He was 7 of 8 for 62 yards on a 13-play, 75-yard drive that culminated in a Luck-to-T.Y. Hilton score that put Indianapolis (1-1) up 21-9 early in the fourth quarter.

"When we needed to, we put a drive together and got points," Luck said. "On the longer drive where we ended up with a touchdown, everybody, we all just did our jobs and we did them well."

Executing first-year coach Frank Reich's creative play-calling scheme, Luck also found Eric Ebron for a touchdown on the game's opening drive. The balanced offensive attack with 27 rushing and 31 passing attempts kept the Redskins' defense off balance and allowed Luck to pick apart a secondary that struggled in coverage and tackling.

The Colts avoided starting 0-2 for the first time since 2013.

"We felt like we let one slip last week," Hilton said. "In the third quarter we kind of went back to our ways and then we picked it up in the fourth quarter and got it going."

After putting up a Week 1-best 182 rushing yards, the Redskins (1-1) put up just 65 yards on 22 carries. Adrian Peterson was limited to 20 yards on 11 carries, and receiver Jamison Crowder was actually Washington's leading rusher with 29 yards on two sweep plays.

Dropped balls and shoddy offensive line play hampered QB Alex Smith on a day he was 33 of 46 for 292 yards.

"Our running game suffered and we were pretty much one-dimensional," coach Jay Gruden said. "We didn't have a very good run plan. ... Didn't give [Peterson] any good looks.

## REDSKINS 31, PACKERS 17

**LANDOVER, Md.** -- Adrian Peterson ran for 120 yards and a pair of 2-yard scores, Alex Smith threw two touchdown passes -- all in the first half Sunday -- and the Washington Redskins held on for a 31-17 victory over a gimpy Aaron Rodgers and the Green Bay Packers, who again had complaints about a roughing-the-passer penalty on Clay Matthews.

On a rainy afternoon, the Redskins [2-1] moved out to leads of 14-0 and, at halftime, 28-10, by putting together TD drives of 74, 75, 79 and 98 yards. Smith connected for TDs of 46 yards to Paul Richardson on the game's fourth play and of 9 to Jamison Crowder in the second quarter.

Peterson, who ran 19 times Sunday, raised his career total to 102 rushing touchdowns, breaking a tie at 100 with Marshall Faulk and Shaun Alexander and moving him alone into seventh place in NFL history behind Emmitt Smith's record of 164. This was Peterson's 52nd game with at least 100 yards on the ground, and first since Nov. 5, 2017, for Arizona against San Francisco.

Playing with a bulky brace on his left knee, which he hurt in Week 1, Rodgers hobbled and limped around, and couldn't do enough to get the Packers [1-1-1] back into the game. He finished 27 for 44 for 265 yards with two TDs -- of 64 yards to Geronimo Allison and 2 yards to Davante Adams -- and was sacked four times.

But Green Bay's receivers had problems with drops, plus Randall Cobb was stripped of the ball by Fabian Moreau -- Josh Norman recovered the fumble -- after a completion with about 5 1/2 minutes remaining in the fourth quarter.

In the third, Packers linebacker Matthews was flagged for roughing Smith -- and there are sure to be more questions about what constitutes a penalty on such plays. Matthews broke in alone on Smith, wrapped him and brought him down. Matthews immediately put his arms up and slapped himself in the helmet as the flag was thrown.

Packers coach Mike McCarthy threw down a play-calling sheet and argued with two officials about the call, even chasing one along the sideline as he backpedaled away.

On Sunday, Smith went 12 for 20 for 220 yards. He also had his streak of 156 consecutive passes without an interception, the longest active run in the NFL, end in the second quarter. Safety Ha Ha Clinton-Dix made the pick when tight end Jordan Reed went one way and Smith threw another.

## SAINTS 43, REDSKINS 19

**NEW ORLEANS** -- Before Drew Brees could blow kisses to the adoring Superdome crowd, before he could embrace his wife and children on the sideline, the Saints' 39-year-old quarterback had to shred one of the NFL's top pass defenses with ruthless efficiency.

And so he did. Brees passed Peyton Manning to become the NFL's all-time leader in yards passing with a 62-yard touchdown to rookie Tre'Quan Smith on Monday night that sent New Orleans on its way to a lopsided 43-19 victory over the mistake-prone Washington Redskins. Brees entered the game needing 201 yards to eclipse Peyton Manning's previous mark of 71,940 yards. He had 250 yards and two touchdowns by halftime and finished 26 of 29 for 363 yards and three touchdowns. He has yet to throw an interception this season. He did, however, make his eighth career reception on his own deflected pass, and pushed across the line of scrimmage to add an extra yard to his career total.

The Saints' Smith, a third-round draft choice last spring, caught two touchdown passes from the 18th-year pro. Brees also hit Smith for a 35-yard score down the right sideline early in the third quarter. Any hope Washington had of coming back was all but snuffed out when Justin Hardee, a special teams regular who was in the game because of Marshon Lattimore's concussion symptoms, snagged Alex Smith's underthrown pass at the Saints' 19-yard line and returned his first career interception to the Washington 4.

That set up change-of-pace QB Taysom Hill's 1-yard touchdown run that put the Saints (4-1) up 40-13. Smith completed 23 of 39 passes for 275 yards for the Redskins (2-2). He ran for a short touchdown late in the first half that pulled Washington within 26-13. When Saints began one of their last first-half possessions on their own 38, Brees needed just 35 yards to break the record. On the first play of the drive, Brees launched a pass toward the right sideline to the speedy Smith, who was wide open and easily sprinted away from Nicholson's tackle attempt en route to the end zone.

Running back Mark Ingram, playing in his first game this season after serving a four-game suspension, scored two touchdowns on 2- and 1-yard runs in the first half. He finished with 53 yards rushing and 20 receiving. The Redskins came in allowing fewer than 190 yards passing per game and spoke of doing what they could to prevent Brees from making history. Instead, they helped Brees pile up first-half yards with third-down penalties that extended two touchdown drives.

Norman's defensive holding penalty during Brees' incomplete pass sustained the Saints' first scoring drive, capped by Ingram's short touchdown run. In the second quarter, Montae Nicholson's unnecessary roughness penalty for leveling Ingram on Ryan Kerrigan's third-down sack extended a drive that ended with Brees' short TD pass to tight end Josh Hill.

## REDSKINS 23, PANTHERS 17

**LANDOVER, Md.** -- Following his prime-time benching and criticism from a former teammate, Josh Norman wanted to shut off his phone because the noise was getting so loud. Then, he silenced it all.

Longtime Redskins safety DeAngelo Hall said Norman had gone "Hollywood," speculation swirled about his value to the Redskins and the flashy cornerback was on the defensive even when he wasn't on the field.

"It was like I was playing cornerback against everybody," said Norman, who had two game-altering plays and four tackles to put an embarrassing showing at New Orleans behind him. "I played within the defense and played within myself."

Defensive teammates mobbed Norman after each of his forced turnovers. After a defensive unit dinner earlier in the week, Norman led the way for a group that made a crucial stop at its 16-yard line to hold on for the victory.

"He came out and performed as he should," safety D.J. Swearinger said. "We needed that from him. He needed that for himself. And we needed to see that as a group."

Norman ended his 19-game interception drought by catching a jump ball thrown by Newton on a third-and-long play early in the second quarter, his first pick since Dec. 24, 2016. Norman also popped the ball out of Panthers rookie receiver D.J. Moore's hands in a showcase performance against the team that abruptly cut ties with him after his All-Pro 2015 season.

"It's fitting that we break that little streak against them," a smiling Norman said. "I guess we got a flair for the dramatic somehow." Newton threw for 275 yards and two touchdowns on 27 of 40 passing and rushed for 43 yards in a turnover-marred loss. He engineered a late drive that got the Panthers into the red zone before stalling out.

Carolina (3-2) was long before that doomed by turnovers, including Moore's on a punt return that set up Alex Smith's 22-yard TD pass to Vernon Davis.

"We kind of dug ourselves in a hole early," Newton said. "We still found a way to put ourselves in a winning position, but we didn't. We'll get better from it."

Adrian Peterson rushed for 97 yards on 17 carries and Smith connected on touchdown passes to Davis and Paul Richardson for the Redskins (3-2), who looked like an entirely different team than the one that got stomped 43-19 by New Orleans on Monday night -- when coach Jay Gruden benched Norman in the second half.

## REDSKINS 20, COWBOYS 17

**LANDOVER, Md.** -- No one on the winning Washington Redskins or the losing Dallas Cowboys seemed entirely sure about the rule that led to a penalty for "snap infraction." That flag turned a 47-yard field-goal try into a 52-yarder that slammed off the left upright as time expired.

"I don't know what happened there," said Redskins coach Jay Gruden, after his club avoided overtime and edged the Cowboys 20-17 Sunday to remain alone atop the NFC East when Dallas' Brett Maher missed the potential tying kick.

His miss foiled a spirited comeback attempt after Redskins linebacker Ryan Kerrigan's strip-sack of Cowboys quarterback Dak Prescott was recovered for a touchdown by Preston Smith with just under five minutes left in the fourth quarter.

That made it 20-10 and was Washington's fourth sack of Prescott, who used smelling salts and was checked for a concussion in the first quarter after taking a shoulder to his helmet at the end of a run. The QB didn't miss a play, returning for the Cowboys' next possession. Prescott lost two fumbles in the game, including one on an earlier fourth-and-1 keeper.

The Redskins (4-2) won consecutive games for the first time this season. The Cowboys dropped to 0-4 on the road, 3-4 overall, as they head into their bye week.

Washington won this one thanks to its staunch defense and 99 yards on 24 carries from Adrian Peterson, who helped mask the latest so-so performance from quarterback Alex Smith and a generally iffy offense that was missing three injured playmakers.

The Redskins twice had to settle for short field goals in the second half despite having first-and-goal opportunities. On each of those possessions, Alex Smith missed an open receiver in the end zone from down close.

Washington's QB finished 14 for 25 for 178 yards, including a 23-yard TD on a swing pass to Kapri Bibbs in the first quarter. But there were some questionable decisions, including running out of bounds on third down with 78 seconds left, stopping the clock before a punt gave the ball back to Dallas.

The Redskins limited Ezekiel Elliott, the NFL's No. 2 rusher entering the week, to 34 yards on 15 carries, the second-lowest total of his pro career.

Prescott was 22 for 35 for 273 yards, with one TD pass and one TD run. He connected with rookie receiver Michael Gallup on a 49-yard score a minute before halftime that made the score 7-all, then -- after Kerrigan's key play made it 20-10 -- scored on a 1-yard quarterback draw to cut Dallas' deficit to three points with 1 1/2 minutes remaining.

The Cowboys got the ball back and drove into Redskins territory thanks, in part, to three consecutive completions from Prescott to Beasley that ate up a total of 33 yards. But in the final seconds, Dallas seemed content to try to get to OT rather than pushing for a go-ahead TD. And, well, the field goal did not go according to plan.

REDSKINS 20, GIANTS 13

**LANDOVER, Md. --** EAST RUTHERFORD, N.J. -- There's a cockiness about the Washington Redskins' defense.

They're shutting down some of the NFL's top running backs, making life miserable for opposing quarterbacks, not giving up many points -- and doing a lot of talking.

Why not? The unit is the major reason the NFC East-leading Redskins (5-2) have matched their best start since 2008.

Safety D.J. Swearinger intercepted two passes, Matt Ioannidis had 2 1/2 sacks, and the Redskins rode their defense to a third straight win, a 20-13 decision over the offensively inept New York Giants on Sunday.

The Redskins sacked a battered Eli Manning seven times, forced the two turnovers, limited Saquon Barkley to 38 yards rushing and made big play after big play in sending New York (1-7) to its fifth straight loss.

Adrian Peterson caught a 7-yard touchdown pass from Alex Smith and ran for a season-high 149 yards, with the last 64 coming on a touchdown jaunt with 3:06 to play. Dustin Hopkins added field goals of 53 and 39 yards for the Redskins. The three-game winning streak is their longest in two seasons.

Aldrick Rosas kicked field goals of 37 and 21 yards for the Giants. Manning, 30 of 47 for 316 yards, hit Evan Engram on a 2-yard touchdown pass with :17 to play.

Engram also let a scoring chance slipped away at the Redskins 32 when a short fourth-down pass went through his fingers with New York down 10-3 early in the fourth quarter.

The Giants came into the game wondering whether the trades this past week of starting cornerback Eli Apple and 2016 All-Pro defensive tackle Damon Harrison would be a problem. New York's defense was fine. Its offense wasn't, and the Redskins' defense was very, very good.

A major difference was Washington capitalized in the red zone, especially in the first half. Smith (20 of 32 for 178 yards) capped a 10-play, 73-yard drive with a TD pass to Peterson, who stepped out of a tackle by backup linebacker Nate Stupar at the 4-yard line.

New York had two trips inside the Washington 20. Swearinger ended the first, stepping inside of Odell Beckham Jr., to intercept a slant pass at the 8-yard line. Rosas kicked a 37-yard field goal on the second drive after passes of 11 yards to Beckham and 24 to Saquon Barkley got New York in scoring position.

Beckham had seven catches for 125 yards. Hopkins missed a 41-yard field goal after the Swearinger interception. Washington never lost the lead in the second half as its defense kept Manning ducking most of the day.

## FALCONS 38, REDSKINS 14

**LANDOVER, Md.** -- Julio Jones set his sights on the end zone, twisted to break a tackle and lunged toward the promised land.

A swarm of teammates rushed over from the sideline, jumping around in jubilation to celebrate the end of the star receiver's 12-game touch-down drought.

Jones was back in the end zone where he belongs, and the Atlanta Falcons looked like the team they were predicted to be in a 38-14 blowout of the Washington Redskins on Sunday that extended their winning streak to three games.

The Falcons [4-4] made plenty of plays in flexing their offensive muscles with the kind of balanced attack they've lacked in an injury-marred season that so far has failed to live up to expectations. Matt Ryan completed 26 of 38 passes for 350 yards and four touchdowns, including the 35-yard screen to Jones that set off a team-wide celebration.

Even though losing four of its first five games didn't give Atlanta much to celebrate, putting up 491 yards on Washington has players excited about their current position and what more they can accomplish this season.

Nowhere is that progress more evident than on the ground, where Coleman ran for 80 yards and Ito Smith had 66 yards and a rushing touch-down. The Falcons surpassed 100 yards rushing for the first time since Week 2.

Atlanta's 30th-ranked defense did its part, too, holding Washington to 35 first-quarter yards and making a crucial stop after Ryan was picked off by Quinton Dunbar -- just the quarterback's third interception this season.

The NFC East-leading Redskins [5-3] could blame poor tackling, ill-timed penalties and a series of injuries along the offensive line for the end of their three-game winning streak.

Already without left tackle Trent Williams after surgery to repair his dislocated right thumb, Washington lost left guard Shaun Lauvao to a left knee injury, right guard Brandon Scherff to a left shoulder injury and struggled to stop the Falcons when it mattered.

Swearinger and other players blamed officials for part of the Redskins' disciplinary trouble that added up to 10 penalties for 147 yards.

Adrian Peterson was held to 17 yards on nine carries a week after rushing for 149 yards at the New York Giants. Alex Smith was 30 of 46 for 306 yards, an interception and a touchdown pass to Josh Doctson.

## REDSKINS 16, BUCCANEERS 3

**TAMPA, Fla.** -- Washington yielded 501 yards and forced Tampa Bay to punt once all day. Sounds like a blueprint for a lopsided loss, yet there the Redskins were in the visiting locker room Sunday celebrating a 16-3 victory that kept them alone atop the NFC East.

That's what four takeaways, three of them foiling scoring opportunities, will do for a team that struggles to score points.

"We gave up some yards. They had great time of possession and some great drives, but we were able to keep them out of the end zone," coach Jay Gruden said. "You've got to keep playing until the drives are over, and good things will happen. We did that."

Alex Smith threw for 178 yards and one touchdown, while Dustin Hopkins kicked three field goals for the Redskins (6-3), who improved their turnover differential to plus-11 and rebounded from a 38-14 loss to Atlanta despite playing with a makeshift offensive line because of mounting injuries.

Smith, who was 19 of 27 with no interceptions, threw 6 yards to Josh Doctson for the game's only touchdown early in the fourth quarter.

Hopkins kicked field goals of 43, 43 and 26 yards, the last set up by Greg Stroman's fourth-quarter interception and 24-yard return to the Bucs 14.

Ryan Fitzpatrick threw for 406 yards for Tampa Bay (3-6), but was intercepted twice and lost a fumble on a sack inside the Washington 10.

The Bucs, who have the NFL's top passing attack and are second in total offense, fell to 1/3 in games they've gained 500-plus yards this season.

Just as discouraging for coach Dirk Koetter and his players: Tampa Bay, which has lost three in a row and six of seven following a 2-0 start, failed to force a turnover on defense for the sixth straight game.

Meanwhile, three of their four giveaways thwarted scoring opportunities, including Jacquizz Rodgers' fumble on a reception that rolled 18 yards into the Washington end zone, where it was recovered by safety Ha Ha Clinton-Dix for a touchback.

The Redskins were outgained 279 yards to 136 in the first two quarters, yet led 6-3 at halftime after getting two field goals from Hopkins.

The Bucs moved into Redskins' territory on all five of their first-half possessions, but had little to show after Norman made a leaping interception on the goal line of a pass intended for Chris Godwin, and Chandler Catanzaro missed a 30-yard field goal. Catanzaro, who's missed four field goals and four extra points through nine games, also had a 47-yarder sail wide right early in the second half.

## TEXANS 23, REDSKINS 21

**LANDOVER, Md.** -- Justin Reid intercepted the ball in the end zone and saw nothing but green grass in front of him.

"I saw the daylight and I have to hit it," Reid said. "I wasn't going to let anyone stop me."

No one's stopping the Houston Texans right now.

Reid's 101-yard interception return touchdown was the big play Houston needed to overcome a mistake-prone Deshaun Watson and beat the Washington Redskins 23-21 on Sunday, tying the franchise record with their seventh consecutive victory.

From a gruesome , season-ending injury to Redskins quarterback Alex Smith to three turnovers, it wasn't pretty, but the Texans (7-3) became the first team since the 1925 New York Giants to win seven in a row after starting 0-3.

"With this team, you never know where the play's going to come from," defensive end J.J. Watt said. "You never know who's going to make it -- offense, defense, special teams -- but you've got to find a way. For the seventh time, we found a way."

While Watson was 16 of 24 for 208 yards, a touchdown and two interceptions, Smith broke his right tibia and fibula on a sack by Kareem Jackson midway through the third quarter and will require surgery. Smith's right leg turned the wrong way in eerily similar fashion to Joe Theismann's broken leg on a Lawrence Taylor sack exactly 33 years ago to the day.

"I know it was very painful for him and heartbreaking for a lot of people," Redskins coach Jay Gruden said. "He's a great guy and hard worker and one of the key leaders on this football team. These things happen in pro football, unfortunately. Just hate to see them happen with a guy like Alex."

Colt McCoy replaced Smith and threw for a touchdown pass and led a long scoring drive for Washington (6-4), which likely will have to rely on the journeyman quarterback the rest of the way. When a McCoy-led drive finished with an Adrian Peterson touchdown to put the Redskins up 21-20 early in the fourth quarter, it was the first lead change in a game involving the Redskins all season.

Houston went ahead for good on a 54-yard field goal by Ka'imi Fairbairn, who missed a 44-yarder earlier. The winning streak stayed alive when Redskins kicker Dustin Hopkins missed a 63-yard field-goal attempt with 3 seconds left.

"We just have belief," Watson said. "Everyone keeps fighting. No one is doubting each other. Regardless, we try to play complementary football, but when the offense needs the defense to help us out, they do that and vice-versa."

## COWBOYS 31, REDSKINS 23

**ARLINGTON, Tx.** -- Ezekiel Elliott made the \$21 donation after his touchdown. Amari Cooper took the freebie following the first of his two scores. The bonus for the Dallas Cowboys: They're all the way back in the NFC East race.

Cooper celebrated his first touchdown with a mock free throw before a 90-yard score that sent him to a Dallas Thanksgiving- record 180 yards receiving, and the Cowboys pulled even with Washington atop the division with a 31-23 win over the Redskins on Thursday.

Elliott ran for 121 yards with his TD and cash celebration as the Cowboys (6-5) won their third straight game since their first home loss, to Tennessee in the Dallas debut of Cooper. Dallas' eighth win in nine Thanksgiving games against Washington, and second in three years, earned a season split.

The Redskins (6-5) lost for the third time in four games in Colt McCoy's first start in four years coming off Alex Smith's season-ending leg injury. The former Texas Longhorns star threw three interceptions to offset two touchdown passes. McCoy won his two previous starts at the home of the Cowboys, one for the 2009 Big 12 championship and the other his most recent NFL victory with the Redskins in 2014.

Amari Cooper had 105 yards after the catch on his two touchdowns. First, Cooper ran away from Quinton Dunbar after the Washington cornerback slipped on a short pass, turning it into a 40-yard TD for a 17-13 lead. Cooper celebrated by mimicking a free throw, shooting the football through the goal post.

On the 90-yarder, Cooper made the catch just outside the Dallas 30, spun out of the arms of Fabian Moreau and won the race to the pylon against former Alabama teammate Ha Ha Clinton-Dix, who tried to shove him out of bounds around the 5. The longest catch of Cooper's career and longest completion in Prescott's three seasons came exactly a month after the Cowboys gave Oakland their first-round pick in the upcoming draft for a new No. 1 receiver.

McCoy looked as if he hadn't started a game in a long time early, throwing into double coverage on his first play and fumbling while trying to scramble on his third, with the Redskins recovering and punting. But McCoy settled in with a couple of third-down passes to Jordan Reed to keep drives going, then hit Vernon Davis in stride on a 53-yard touchdown -- the longest Washington completion of the season -- for a 7-7 tie.

The Cowboys were having all the fun before the Redskins pulled even, with Elliott scoring on a 16-yard run and dropping \$21 into a giant Salvation Army red kettle behind the end zone. The cash was handed to him by a team photographer.

After scoring on a scrambling 5-yard run for the third Dallas touchdown in less than eight minutes and a 31-13 lead, Prescott let Elliott help him into another kettle on the other end of the field, drawing the same unsportsmanlike conduct penalty Elliott did two years ago. Elliott missed the Thanksgiving game last year on his six-game suspension over domestic violence allegations.

**Philadelphia, Pa. --** Carson Wentz was at his best back on the move again. Wentz tossed two touchdown passes, Darren Sproles ran for a score and the Philadelphia Eagles stayed in the hunt for the NFC East title with a 28-13 victory over the depleted Washington Redskins on Monday night.

The Eagles (6-6) won consecutive games for the first time since Nick Foles led them to a Super Bowl victory over the Patriots.

The Redskins (6-6) lost backup quarterback Colt McCoy to a serious right leg injury in his second game replacing Alex Smith, who broke his right tibia and fibula on Nov. 18. Mark Sanchez took his place.

Redskins coach Jay Gruden said after the game that, from what he understands, McCoy fractured his fibula and will miss the rest of the season.

Adrian Peterson ran 90 yards for a touchdown on Sanchez's first play under center, giving the Redskins a 10-7 lead. It was the longest run Philadelphia has allowed in franchise history but Washington's lead didn't last long.

Wentz, who hasn't scrambled much since returning in Week 3 from surgery to repair two knee ligaments, didn't run for any yards. But he ran around and made big plays when he improvised and on designed rollouts.

Sproles put Philadelphia up 14-10 on a 14-yard TD run in the second quarter. Wentz tossed a 4-yard TD pass to Jordan Matthews and connected with Golden Tate on a 2-point conversion to extend the lead to 22-13 early in the fourth quarter.

The Eagles twice failed to score inside the red zone and still managed their second-highest point total this season.

They had a first down at the Redskins 2 in the second quarter, but Josh Adams was stopped for a loss on fourth down from the 1.

They had a first down at the Redskins 5 in the third quarter, but Wentz threw an interception right to Josh Norman.

Wentz finished 27 of 39 for 306 yards. He came out firing and led the Eagles to a score on their opening drive for only the third time season.

First, he scrambled out of the pocket, motioned Tate to go deep and lofted a 19-yard pass down the left sideline on a first-and-15. Wentz finished the drive by firing a 6-yard TD pass on the run to Tate.

Dustin Hopkins kicked field goals of 47 and 44 yards for Washington.

## GIANTS 40, REDSKINS 16

**LANDOVER, Md.** -- Saquon Barkley was so upset at himself about dropping a pass he apologized to the rest of the New York Giants' offense.

Barkley more than made up for that early mistake, rushing for 170 yards, including a 78-yard touchdown, to surpass 1,000 for the season to lead the Giants to a 40-16 rout of the Redskins on Sunday to effectively end Washington's already-slim playoff hopes.

Barkley gashed the Redskins' defense for 12.1 yards a carry to become the first Giants rookie to break 1,000 yards and set a single-season franchise rookie record with his 13th touchdown. The second overall pick also had four catches for 27 yards against a Washington defense that's a shell of the unit that led the league early in the season.

Manning was 14 of 22 for 197 yards in helping New York take a 40-0 lead in the third quarter before giving way to rookie Kyle Lauletta early in the fourth. Sterling Shepard, Bernie Fowler and Russell Shepard caught TD passes from Manning as the Giants (5-8) put up 40 points in a game for the first time since Nov. 1, 2015, and won for the fourth time in the past five games.

"We came down here as a 4-8 team that I feel like we're getting better," coach Pat Shurmur said. "We're playing more in a way that's evidence that we're getting better and we're on the right track."

The Giants intercepted new Redskins quarterback Mark Sanchez twice with Curtis Riley scoring on a 9-yard pick-6 in the first quarter. It was Sanchez's ninth career interception returned for a touchdown.

Sanchez, making his first NFL start since 2015, was 6 of 14 for 38 yards and the two interceptions and didn't have a completion longer than 10 yards. He was sacked five times behind a patchwork offensive line as the Redskins (6-7) lost their fourth in a row.

Coach Jay Gruden said "nothing" worked for Sanchez and pulled the plug on his appearance with 5 1/2 minutes remaining in the third quarter. In came newly signed Josh Johnson, the Redskins' fourth QB this season. Johnson hadn't appeared in an NFL game since 2013 or thrown a pass since 2011.

Signed after Alex Smith and Colt McCoy each broke a leg and because of his familiarity with Gruden's offense, Johnson completed 11 of 16 passes for 195 yards, a touchdown and an interception and ran for 45 yards and his first career rushing TD in garbage time.

Gruden said Johnson will start the next game against Jacksonville.
