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OT Cornelius Lucas

On the cohesiveness of the offensive line and adjusting to injured players:

“Simply put, next man up. Everyone in the room has a starter mentality and when your number is called you have to perform. It’s simply that.”

On if that mentality helps to replace a player like Jacksonville Jaguars G Brandon Scherff

“Because everyone in the room has experience. Everyone in the room feels confident and capable to do their job. So yeah definitely.”

On his thoughts on QB Carson Wentz:

“I think he is a hell of a player. A hell of a guy and a hell of a football player. I think he prepares well and one of the best in the business I have seen so far.”

On what it would mean to break the Ravens preseason winning streak:

“Let me think about that, it would be great! Winning is always great. Beating someone who has won 22 preseason games would be great. So yeah, it would be great.”

On the celebration that would call for:

“Probably a dance or two, maybe some celebratory chicken wings.”

On the time it takes to gel with the offensive line as a swing tackle:

“Simply put, life comes at you fast. So, I don’t think there is a certain duration of time. It’s like, hey, Luke you got to go at left tackle. Hey Luke, you got to go at right tackle. His shoe fell off its time to go in the game. That’s about the duration of time you have to get into the game.”

On if he has had to substitute for a player that lost his shoe:

“Definitely.”

On his recovery from his injury:

“I’ve been waiting to talk about this, but today is probably not a good day so you should probably talk to [Head Athletic Trainer] Al [Bellamy] our trainer about what I was dealing with. But yeah man I feel like I’m ready to rock and roll and play some football. Ready to get back out there with my teammates and have a good season. I don’t really know what to say I can only point you in that direction. It was something small ill leave it at that.”

On if his injury took him by surprise:

“No not really, it was over a gradual period of time.”

On if he feels any discomfort playing now:

“No, I feel free as a bird.”

On if playing with a new QB changes the timing of the offensive line:

“Some quarterbacks use their cadence differently. Their drops maybe a little more shallow or deeper but as you practice, and you get to know them that stuff goes away, and you start to get with them.”

On the adjustment with blocking for QB Carson Wentz:

“Carson is a but taller so he can stand a little closer tin the pocket whereas QB Taylor Heinicke may have to be further back in order to see the field.”

On getting along with QB Carson Wentz:

“We actually just had a two-hour conversation on the plane ride. He’s into hunting, he likes popcorn, and the guy is a feign for gluten free biscuits.”
