COMMANDERS-EAGLES POSTGAME NOTES

- **The Washington Commanders** defeated the Philadelphia Eagles 24-17 on Sunday afternoon.
- **Washington** possessed the ball for nine minutes and 48 seconds on its opening possession. It's the longest first possession for Washington since at least 2001.
- **Washington** rushed for 30 net rushing yards on their opening drive. That brings their rushing total this season to 2,177 rushing yards. That currently ranks No. 9 all-time in franchise history in a single season.
- Following RB Chris Rodriguez Jr.'s touchdown, **Washington** has moved their single season rushing yard total to 2,191 yards. That now passes the 2005 team (2,183) for No. 8 all-time in franchise history in total rushing yards in a single season. (Note that the NFL added a 17th game in 2021.).
- **QB Josh Johnson** completed 14-of-22 passes for 131 yards, one touchdown and one interception. He also rushed for 45 yards and one rushing touchdown.
- **Johnson** rushed for a touchdown for the first time since Week 14 of 2018.
- This was the first game since Week 14 of 2018 that **Johnson** rushed and thrown for a touchdown in the same game.
- **TE John Bates** caught two passes for 13 yards and one touchdown.
- **Bates** recorded a touchdown reception for the first time since Bates since Week 12, 2022.
- **WR Terry McLaurin** caught four passes for 57 yards.
- **McLaurin** has recorded his 68th career reception against the Philadelphia Eagles in the first quarter. He has passed Pierre Garcon (67) and Pat Tilley (67) for No. 10 all-time in NFL history in reception against Philadelphia.
- **McLaurin** has amassed 1,000-plus career receiving yards against the Philadelphia Eagles. He is now the fifth player in franchise history to amass 1,000-plus career receiving yards against Philadelphia. He joins Jason Witten, Art Monk, Bobby Mitchell, Charley Taylor, Gary Clark, Amani Toomer, Bobby Hayes and Michael Irvin as the only players in NFL history to accomplish the feat.
- **McLaurin** has passed Bobby Mitchell (70) for No. 3 all-time in career receptions in franchise history against the Philadelphia Eagles.

- **McLaurin** has passed Gary Clark (1,014) for No. 4 all-time in career receiving yards in franchise history against the Philadelphia Eagles.
- **RB Chris Rodriguez Jr.** rushed for a team-leading 65 yards and one touchdown.
- **Rodriguez Jr.** rushed for his tenth career rushing touchdown in the second quarter.
- **CB Noah Igbinoghene** totaled three tackles, one sack and one quarterback hit.
- **Igbinoghene** recorded his first career sack in the third quarter.
- **OLB Von Miller** recorded two tackles, one sack, one tackle for loss and one quarterback hit.
- **Miller** recorded 9.0 sacks this season, the most sacks he has had in a single season since 2021 (9.5).
- With 138.5 career sacks, **Miller** has now tied with LB DeMarcus Ware for No.9 all-time in NFL history in official sacks (since 1982).
- **S Jeremy Reaves** finished with six total tackles, two passes defensed and one interception.
- **Reaves** recorded his second career interception and first since Week 17 of the 2020 season.
- **LB Bobby Wagner** totaled five tackles in the season finale.
- Per Pro Football Reference, **Wagner** has surpassed 2,000 career tackles becoming one of three players in NFL history to accomplish the feat. He joins Hall of Fame LB Ray Lewis and LB London Fletcher.
- **K Jake Moody** connected on one field goal and three point after attempts.
- **Moody** connected on a 56-yard field goal at the end of the second quarter. That is the second longest field goal in his career and the longest since a 57-yard field goal in Week 2 of the 2023 season.
- With this game, **P Tress Way** has now tied with Len Hauss for fifth most games played by a player in franchise history (196).
